

A bill to set the age of buying Pepper Spray at 16 years old

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2	SECTION 1.	82% of assault cases are committed on those under the age of 18. Due to
3		the differences of purchasing ages across the nation, most teenagers do
4		not have access to pepper spray to protect themselves. Decreasing the
5		age limit will lead to an increase of protection for teenagers. Those within
6		the age range of 16-17 are not able to legally purchase pepper spray but
7		are four times more likely to be assaulted. Because of this, there is a need
8		to decrease the age of purchasing pepper spray in the nation from 18 to
9		16 years old.
10	SECTION 2.	Pepper spray, equal to or below 2.5 ounces of active product will be en-
11		stated as a form of self-defense available for purchase to those 16 years
12		of age or older with some form of age identification.
13	SECTION 3.	The Department of Commerce will oversee the implementation of this
14		bill.
15	SECTION 4.	This will go into effect immediately.
16	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
