Dear Coaches and Students:

You are cordially invited to the 2021 KHSSL State Debate Championship, which will be held March 12-13 online via Tabroom Campus. Note that the Final Rounds of the KHSSL State Senior Speech Tournament will be held between rounds of this tournament on Saturday, and any student who wishes to fully participate in both contests can and should do so. Please read this invitation thoroughly and carefully.

EVENTS AND REGISTRATION

State contests will be held in the following events.

Congressional Debate

Lincoln-Douglas Debate / Novice

Lincoln-Douglas Debate / Varstiy

Policy Debate

Public Forum Debate / Novice

Public Forum Debate / Varsity

In each debate event, you may have **up to three (3) entries.** You may enter **up to 10 students** in Congressional Debate. **No doubling.**

Registration is on Tabroom at http://khssldebatechampionship.tabroom.com/ and is due by 11 PM Eastern on February 27. This is a firm deadline. Drop/Add will end nine days later on March 8 at 8 PM; no adds after. After February 27, adds go through the KHSSL email address ONLY (khsslboard@gmail.com -- no texts or calls for changes. Automatic heavy penalties kick in for drops after March 8, so please try to be accurate early. See KHSSL Handbook pages 72 and 73 for a complete list.



DEFINITION OF NOVICE

A novice debater shall be defined as any student in his/her first year of debate. That means if a student competed at Congress one time in a prior year or in a debate round one time in a prior year, that student is now a Varsity debater.

SCHEDULE AND ROUNDS

- Congressional Debate will have three 2-hour prelims and a 3-hour final session.
- Varsity and Novice Public Forum and Lincoln-Douglas shall compete in five preliminary rounds plus a Semifinal (best 4) and Final (winners of Semifinals) unless numbers require larger numbers of students in outrounds (see Handbook page 73).
- Policy is expecting a three-round Round Robin unless unexpected entries emerge.

- A full schedule of expected rounds is at the end of this invitation.

ENTRY FEES

Entry fees are \$12 per Congress entry, \$16 per Lincoln-Douglas entry (Novice or Varsity), and \$32 per Public Forum (Novice or Varisty) or Policy Debate team.

TOURNAMENT RULES

<u>The KHSSL Handbook</u> contains extensive information about how the State Tournament is put together and how tabulation determines advancement. Coaches are responsible for understanding these procedures and for explaining them to your team and their parents, your judges, etc.



JUDGES

Judge Obligations and Hire Fees

- The judge quota is set at one judge required per five entries or fraction thereof for Congressional Debate
- The judge quota is set at one judge required per two entries for all other events.
- Teams may hire up to but not more than half your quota for \$130 each if you are bringing other judges, but you <u>must provide at least half of your judges required</u> regardless.
- It is considered standard operating procedure for the team coach to be one of the judges you bring as this is state tournament, and we want our best people in the judging pool to determine the state winners!
- All judges are obligated for all rounds. <u>Please note</u> that judges must be available the full
 day to count for the day, so no "Please no finals" requests unless you're willing to pay the
 \$65 per day charge for a judge. We need you!
- It is not KHSSL's norm to publish judge paradigms nor to honor requests for judge blocks without extraordinary circumstances. Contact the Executive Director with concerns.

Judge Training

From the Handbook regarding Debate Judges:

A qualified Debate judge is a judge who meets one of the following criteria:

- Judged at a minimum of one tournament during this season or during previous, recent seasons, and was trained either through the League's Judge Training Program and/or by the coach of the School. (KHSSL recommends the <u>NFHS Judge Training Program</u> for judges new to Debate:
- Debated in High School and/or College
- Currently coaching or formerly coached



CONGRESSIONAL DEBATE

Due to screen restrictions, chambers of Congress will be restricted to thirteen participants per session (plus the Parliamentarian and two scorers). This is a pandemiconly rule change. In future years, we will return to chamber sizes as per the Handbook.

Only **NEW legislation** may be submitted for KHSSL Congress. Violating this rule is a violation of the Code of Ethics.

Schools must **upload legislation through Tabroom** as part of their entry; limit of **three items per school.**

Students **MUST** use established templates to write legislation. That includes double-spacing, single page, and line numbers. See this website to download these templates:

TABROOM AND CAMPUS

New judges should browse <u>here</u> and <u>here</u> to get started with establishing a Tabroom account.

Students without Tabroom accounts should browse here and follow instructions.

All debaters and judges will have to have accounts AND be linked to their school's account to participate in the state tournament. Get this finished early, not near the start of the tournament.

Information will be coming regarding school needs for Campus if you plan to have any students or judges work from school WiFi as they debate or judge. This information will be sent to registered coaches in early March.



AWARDS

An awards program will be presented on the KHSSL YouTube channel at 7:30 PM Eastern on Monday, March 15 (immediately followed by the State Senior Speech Awards program). Coaches are strongly encouraged to plan watch parties with their teams (through virtual communications, of course).

In addition to the winners and high placement honors given in each event, speaker awards will also be given based on preliminary rounds in Debate events. I will mail out small awards soon after I receive your school's fees (or hand-deliver them in Lexington). For larger awards like team trophies (which are way too big to mail), you can expect in-person delivery from me in the Spring once I've been vaccinated (I'm 1C, so coming soon, but not yet). I look forward to a road trip of bling visits before June! If those winners' coaches make trips into Lexington before I've delivered (or if you have college students coming home for a weekend from UK or Transy, etc.), I'm happy to schedule a trophy exchange from their current resting place in my garage and send them to you that way.

I'll release ballots and scores later that evening so teams may have time to watch together, etc. Remember that students must be linked into your team Tabroom account (with their own Tabroom accounts established) to be able to see their ballots.
