Tournament Procedure

Thursday and Friday Before the Tournament

All participants must (see below for technical details):

- have or create a Tabroom ID and be sure their Coach links that ID to their entry in the tournament.
- have or install Zoom and update it to the latest version;
- have or create a Zoom ID;
- ***By 6PM Friday*** register for the Zoom meeting using their Zoom ID and the link

We will check the Zoom registrations against the Tabroom registrations before approving them. Once approved, Zoom will send an email to the Zoom ID/email with a unique link giving that individual access to the tournament Zoom meeting on Saturday morning.

We will check Tabroom registrations to make sure students are linked properly. We will notify their Coach if they are not.

Saturday

The general meetings, case prep, judges' workshop and final round will all be held in the Zoom meeting. Debates will be held using Tabroom's Campus facility.

- 8:30AM: Zoom meeting will open to debaters, observers, judges and coaches (Zoom email will say the meeting starts at 8AM, but no one will be admitted before 8:30!)
- 9AM: Announcements, resolution packet released, case prep and judges workshop begin.
- 10AM: Round 1 of debate starts in Tabroom/Campus.

Technical Requirements

See the [CDA Online Procedures Guide](#) for a more detailed explanation.

1. All participants--debaters, judges, coaches, observers-- will need Zoom installed on their device. See page 8 of the [CDA Online Procedures Guide](#) for information on how to install Zoom.
2. If Zoom is already installed, please be sure it is the latest version. Start Zoom, click on the user icon in the upper right corner, and select "Check for Updates".
3. All participants must have a Zoom id/email. See page 8-9 of the [CDA Online Procedures Guide](#) for information on how to create a Zoom id.
4. All participants must register for the Zoom meeting using their Zoom ID and the following link:

Once they register and I approve their registration, they will receive an email with a unique link to the meeting on Saturday morning. This link cannot be shared or used by anyone other than the person who registered.

5. All debaters, student judges and coaches will need a Tabroom ID linked to their entry. See page 9 of the [CDA Online Procedures Guide](#) for information on how to install Google's Chrome browser and create Tabroom ID. (Even though we are not using Tabroom/Campus rooms to debate, they will need access to Tabroom to see their debating and judging assignments.)
6. Each debate team must have a "back channel" so they can communicate during the debate while the other team is speaking, unless the two debaters are in the same location sharing a connection. Communication can be through cell phones, a chat function, shared document, etc.
