# A Bill to Implement Ranked Choice Voting in All Federal Elections

- 1. **SECTION 1:** All federal elections shall utilize a ranked choice voting system.
- 2. SECTION 2: Ranked choice voting is defined as a system of voting in which voters
- 3. rank candidates by preference on their ballots. If a candidate wins a majority of
- 4. first-preference votes, he/she is declared the winner. If no candidate wins a majority of
- **5.** first-preference votes, the candidate with the fewest first-preference votes is eliminated.
- **6.** The second-preference choices indicated on those ballots will then be considered. A new
- 7. tally is conducted to determine whether any candidate has won a majority of the adjusted
- **8.** votes. The process is repeated until a candidate wins an outright majority.
- 9. **SECTION 3:** The Federal Election Commission shall oversee the enactment of this bill.
- 10. SECTION 4: This piece of legislation shall go into effect January 1, 2022.
- 11. SECTION 5: All laws in conflict with this piece of legislation are hereby declared null and void.

# A Resolution to Designate the Humanitarian Crisis in Xinjiang as "Genocide"

- 1. Whereas the Chinese government currently holds between one million and three million
- 2. Uighur Muslims in over 380 "re-education" camps; and
- 3. Whereas these "re-education" internment camps; are known to subject Uighur women to
- 4. mass sterilization and to use waterboarding, sexual abuse, and other forms of torture; and
- 5. Whereas The actions of the Chinese government are in direct violation of Article 2 of the
- **6.** United Nations Convention on the Prevention and Punishment of the Crime of Genocide.
- 7. Whereas under definition of the Convention on the Prevention and Punishment of the
- **8.** Crime of Genocide, the atrocities occurring in Xinjian, China are genocide;
- 9. Therefore Be it Resolved by this Student Congress here assembled that the United
- 10. States declare the atrocities in Xinjiang, China to be genocide and that our U.N.
- 11. Ambassador and diplomatic office engage the mechanisms of the U.N. to formally
- 12. declare the crisis a genocide, to hold the Chinese government accountable and to bring
- **13.** the genocide to an end.

### A Bill to Lower the Interest Rate on Payday Loans

- 1. SECTION 1: The United States Code Title 26.A.1.A.II.11.c. "Exceptions" shall be
- 2. altered to include a sub point (4) which will state as follows "All corporations that offer
- 3. 'Payday Loans' shall have an increased tax rate of .5% for each 1% the corporation's
- **4.** average loan rate is above the base interest rate."
- 5. SECTION 2: The base interest rate is defined as the Federal Reserve discount rate on the
- **6.** date of loan origination rate plus 24%.
- 7. SECTION 3: "Payday Loans" are defined as ones that offer loans that have a maturity of
- **8.** less than six weeks or use a borrower's future paycheck as collateral. The Department of Financial Protection and Innovation DFPI shall oversee implementation and enforcement of this bill.
- 9. SECTION 4: This bill shall take effect immediately upon passage.
- 10. SECTION 5: All laws in conflict with this piece of legislation are hereby declared null11. and void.

### A Bill to Reduce Animal Experimentation

- 1. SECTION 1: All animals categorized as monkeys, dogs, and cats may not be subject to
- 2. experimentation in any private or government laboratory.
- 3. SECTION 2: Experimentation under this regulation shall be defined as any
- 4. research, testing, entertainment or teaching practices which use animals covered under
- **5.** this regulation.
- 6. SECTION 3: The Public Health Service, or PHS, will oversee the enforcement of this
- 7. Legislation.
- 8. SECTION 4: The Public Health Service annual budget will include funding to employ
- 9. an additional 1000 inspectors who will be responsible for overseeing and maintaining
- 10. quality inspections of
- 11. laboratory animal facilities, breeding and dealing of animals, zoos, and circuses.
- 12. SECTION 5: This legislation shall go into effect on January 1, 2022.
- 13. SECTION 6: All laws in conflict with this piece of legislation are hereby declared null
- 14. and void.

## A Resolution to Increase the Federal Refugee Limit to Accommodate Displaced Afghans

- 1. Whereas, The Taliban has gained control over the Afghan state and has imposed Sharia
- 2. law upon its constituents, and that freedoms and rights previously enjoyed are now
- 3. threatened or nonexistent and,
- 4. Whereas, The United Nations projects that half a million Afghans will flee Afghanistan
- 5. during its transition of government and,
- 6. Whereas, U.S. troop withdraw has precipitated a safety crisis for many Afghans and
- 7. created a burgeoning refugee crisis which will destabilize the region and lead to mass
- 8. suffering and loss of life.
- 9. Therefore Be it Resolved by this Student Congress here assembled that the federal
- 10. refugee limit is increased from 62,500 to 100,000 for the fiscal years of 2021 and 2022.
