A Bill to Eliminate the Monopoly that Meat Processors Currently have with US Meats

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

Section 1. The USDA should build regional meat processing plants through the US so that the few meat processing plants don't have a monopoly on US meat products. Currently the few large processing plants control the price that farmers can receive for their livestock.

Section 2. Cargill, Tyson Foods, JBS (SA), & National Beef Packing Co. control 85% of US meat processing

- 1. This would allow farmers to have regional processing plants to choose to process their livestock
- 2. This would allow farmer to get better prices for their livestock
- 3. Currently farmers can receive a lower price for their livestock as the meat being sold from these large processing plants skyrockets upward.
- 4. This would give producers a choice of where they take their livestock

Section 3.The USDA will be in charge of implementing and enforcement of this new bill.

- 1. The USDA will oversee the construction and completion of the regional processing plants.
- 2. The USDA shall be charged with selecting these new sites to better serve our US Farmers.

SECTION 4. This legislation will take place one year from the close of this congressional session

A Bill to Regulate and Protect Aftermarket Products for Vehicles

A Bill to Make Cryptocurrency a Security

A Bill to Ban Mask Mandates

BE IT INACTED BY THE CONGRESS THAT:

- Section 1: This bill will ban government and private businesses from enacting mask mandates.
- Section 2: Mask mandates: any order or law requiring medical face masks in public areas.

 Mask: any face covering intended to prevent the spread of disease.
- **Section 3**: The Department of Health will oversee the implication of this law.
 - a. Businesses that do not comply will be fined as small as \$1,000 to as much as \$10,000.
 - b. The only exception to this law is hospitals and doctors' offices.
- **Section 4**: This bill will take into effect immediately upon passing.
- **Section 5**: All other laws that conflict with this legislation will hereby be declared null and void.
