Competition for 7th and 8th-grade students will be offered in the following events:

- Original Oratory
- Informative Speaking
- Extemporaneous Speaking
- Duo Interpretation (Virtual)
- Lincoln-Douglas Debate
- Dramatic Interpretation (Virtual)
- Humorous Interpretation (Virtual)
- Prose/Poetry Reading (Virtual)

All entries should be entered on Tabroom no later than Wednesday, October 27, 2021, @ 3:00 pm.

Video links should be entered in Tabroom no later than Thursday, October 28, @ 6:00 pm.

<u>Please check the links of your videos. If a judge cannot view the video, that student will receive the last rank in the room.</u>

Please submit all entries on Tabroom.

COVID-19 Protocols:

- 1. Masking while in the building is required; except while eating and performing.
- 2. Ballots will be virtual and can be found on Tabroom during the tournament.
- 3. Each school will have its own room that is its own common area. Smaller schools will be paired together to allow us more room for competition.

Individual Event Rules:

Extemporaneous Speaking: Topics will be based on current events. 30-minute prep time. No internet is allowed during prep time. Time limit: 5 minutes maximum.

Duo Interpretation: A memorized humorous or dramatic piece performed from a published source by 2 students following NSDA guidelines, no original content except for the introduction. Time limit: 5 minutes maximum.

Original Oratory: The speech must be the original work of the contestant. No more than 150 words may be a direct quotation. The presentation should be memorized. Time limit: 5 minutes maximum.

Humorous Interpretation: Selection may be taken from any published novel, play, or short story. Selections must possess literary merit and be age-appropriate. An adequate introduction should be provided. No props may be used. Selections should be memorized. Time limit: 5 minutes maximum.

Dramatic Interpretation: Selection may be taken from any published novel, play, or short story. Selections must possess literary merit and be age-appropriate. An adequate introduction should be provided. No props may be used. Selections should be memorized. Time limit: 5 minutes maximum.

Prose/Poetry Reading: Selections must be from a published source. Selections must possess literary merit and be age-appropriate. An adequate introduction should be provided. No props may be used. Selections should not be memorized. Prose selections must be no more than 50% dialogue. Poetry selections may be a combination of short poems on the same theme or by the same author OR they may be from a longer poetic piece. Time limit: 4 minutes maximum.

Informative Speaking: Original informative speech performed from memory, students may use non-electronic visual aids following NSDA rules. Time limit: 5 minutes maximum.

Lincoln-Douglas Debate Rules:

- 1. The Lincoln-Douglas Debate proposition shall be the Novice NSDA topic: Resolved: Civil disobedience in a democracy is morally justified.
- Lincoln-Douglas rounds may be "flighted", meaning that (depending on the size of the tournament), the schedule might have two sets of debates scheduled for the same room during the round.
- 3. Lincoln-Douglas format to be used for middle school is as follows:

Affirmative Constructive 3 minutes
Cross-Examination 2 minutes
Negative Constructive 4 minutes
Cross-Examination 2 minutes
1st Affirmative Rebuttal 2 minutes
Negative Rebuttal 2 minutes
2nd Affirmative Rebuttal 1 minute

2 minutes of prep per side

General Rules:

- Each school must be accompanied by an adult sponsor.
- Sweepstakes awards are presented for first, second, and third place.
- Awards for the Top 6 will be presented for all events.
- Campus regulations prohibit the use of tobacco products, drugs, and alcohol.
- No food or drink is to be taken out of the cafeteria.
- Failure to comply with these regulations will result in the elimination of that contestant.
- Fees are due for cancellations made after the deadline.
- Entry fee is \$5.00 per entry.

Sweepstakes Rules:

- A school's best two entries in each event earn sweepstakes points.
- 10 points qualify for finals
- 5 points 3rd place
- 10 points 2nd place
- 15 points 1st place
