Third and fourth year debaters are welcome to judge the Novice division. Entries will be prioritized by (1) schools who host tournaments to which we are invited,

(2) schools who host tournaments, and (3) all others.

loss.

All KSHSAA regulations will be enforced. Grievances are due in writing within 10 minutes at conclusion of the disputed round.
