

# The 2nd Annual Fall Finale

December 4-5, 2021

On behalf of Lafayette Forensics and the Cornhusker Speech and Debate team, you are cordially invited to the second annual Fall Finale! The experience will span Saturday and Sunday, December 4-5, 2021. The tournament will consist of six rounds and appropriate elimination of NFA-LD starting on Saturday over a relaxed two-day schedule. We will offer JV and rookie divisions of NFA-LD debate as entries warrant.

The tournament will use <u>Tabroom.com</u> for registration and tabulation with <u>Zoom</u> used for competition rounds. Every competitor and judge must have a <u>Tabroom.com</u> account at the time of registration that is correctly linked to their school's account. All other relevant information will be posted on announcements through Tabroom.com and on the tournament website.

We are making a very serious effort to provide qualified hired judges to work the tournament. Several Lafayette and UNL alums and former competitors have committed to judging at the tournament. All judges will be required to have a Tabroom.com account for e-ballots AND must have a judge philosophy/paradigm on Tabroom.com.

Every effort will be made to make this an enjoyable experience for all of those involved. The tournament schedule is built so that at the very least, the tournament will run on time and hopefully run ahead of schedule. The schedule has also been constructed to balance tournament efficiency with competitor and judge wellness.

# **Registration Instructions**

Registration will take place online at Saturday, December 4th at 9:00 am CST until 9:45 am in the tournament Zoom room. Teams will be required to confirm that competitors and judges are all accounted for using Tabroom.com

#### **Divisions and Eligibility**

The tournament will offer varsity, junior varsity, and rookie (novice) divisions of competition. For the purpose of this tournament:

**Varsity**: Any student eligible to compete in NFA-LD debate

<u>Junior Varsity</u>: Any student in their first two years (four semesters of college debate). Where there is no official sanction, the tournament directors ask all coaches to consider a debater's skill level when making this designation.

**Rookie**: Any student in their first year of debate (two semesters or six tournaments). If a competitor competed in NSDA-level policy, LD, or public forum debates, we ask that you place them in the Junior Varsity division.

If you have questions, please petition the tournament director for clarification or to discuss a particular student's eligibility. Exceptions will be determined on a case-by-case basis.

#### **Tournament Rules and Notes**

Debate Tabulation. Unless size of the field dictates otherwise, the first two rounds will be random, and the rest of the rounds will be paired high-low within brackets except for round 5, which will be paired high-high within brackets. Seeding within brackets will be based on SOP Pairing methodology is subject to change, but is not confidential, you may always ask the tournament directors which pairing methodology is used for a given round. The tournament will make every effort to ensure that no student is pulled up twice and that no student debates against a pull-up twice.

Elimination Rounds. Students will be seeded in the appropriate elimination round using the following criteria: (1) wins; (2) opposition wins; (3) adjusted points; (4) double adjusted points; (5) total points. Brackets will not be broken in elimination rounds.

*Schedule.* All rounds will be scheduled in the Central Time Zone on Tabroom. A time zone conversion chart will be provided on the website and on tabroom.

*Disclosure*. The results of the debates will be available on Tabroom.com immediately following the release of pairings for the subsequent round. For example, round 2 results will be available immediately after round 3 pairings are released.

*Ethics.* The tournament will conform to the NFA bylaws and competitors will be expected to have read and understood the NFA Code of Ethics.

Lafayette and UNL competitors will be competing in the tournament. They will be eligible for awards and elimination round participation and team sweepstakes. Tabulation decisions made regarding any placement of debaters or judges in rounds involving UNL or Lafayette will be made by tabulation staff not associated with either university. Any issues with tabulation, pairing, or awards can be raised with the tournament staff or tabulation team.

The wonderful Shanna Carlson has agreed to tabulate the tournament. Any rounds involving Illinois State debaters will be reviewed by the tournament director prior to pairings release.

#### <u>Judging</u>

We want your judges! We want to hire judges for flexibility, not to make ends meet. ALL COVERED SLOTS ARE FREE. <u>All teams must cover 75% of their entry.</u> All judges will be obligated through quarterfinals. We will ask you to stay through semifinals if we are hurting for clean/eligible judges.

All debate judges are required to have a Tabroom.com account and judge philosophy/paradigm.

#### <u>Awards</u>

We will recognize the top 10 speakers in the varsity division, and the top 3 speakers in the Junior Varsity and Rookie divisions.

Recognition will be given to all participants in elimination rounds.

Team Sweepstakes awards will be awarded to the top schools in attendance. The formula will be modeled after the NFA sweepstakes formula.

### **Tournament Entry**

All entries must be made directly online at <u>Tabroom</u> by Wednesday, December 1, 2021 at 5pm.

ALL JUDGES MUST have a Tabroom.com account for online ballots AND DEBATE JUDGES MUST have a judge philosophy/paradigm on Tabroom.com
