<u>Please check the links of your videos. If a judge cannot view the video, that student will</u> receive the last rank in the room.

Please submit all entries on Tabroom.

Individual Event Rules:

- <u>Extemporaneous Speaking:</u> Topics will be based off of the NSDA USX questions from October, November, and December. 30-minute prep time. No internet is allowed during prep time. A singular notecard may be permitted to use during filming of the speech. <u>Time limit: 5 minutes maximum.</u>
- <u>Duo Interpretation:</u> A memorized humorous or dramatic piece performed from a published source by 2 students following NSDA guidelines, no original content except for the introduction. <u>Time limit: 5-10 minutes, 30 second grace.</u>
- <u>Dramatic Interpretation:</u> Selection may be taken from any published novel, play, or short story. Selections must possess literary merit and be age-appropriate. An adequate introduction should be provided. No props may be used. Selections should be memorized. <u>Time limit: 5-10 minutes, 30 second grace.</u>
- <u>Humorous Interpretation:</u> Selection may be taken from any published novel, play, or short story. Selections must possess literary merit and be age-appropriate. An adequate introduction should be provided. No props may be used. Selections should be memorized. <u>Time limit: 5-10 minutes, 30 second grace</u>.
- <u>Informative Speaking:</u> Original informative speech performed from memory, students may use non-electronic visual aids following NSDA rules. <u>Time limit: 5-10 minutes, 30 second grace.</u>

^{*} If there are not at least 6 entries in both Prose and Poetry they will be combined.

- Original Oratory: The speech must be the original work of the contestant. No more than 150 words may be a direct quotation. The presentation should be memorized. <u>Time limit: 5-10 minutes, 30 second grace.</u>
- <u>Poetry Reading:</u> Selections must be from a published source. Selections must possess literary merit (a plot and theme/moral) and be age-appropriate. An adequate introduction should be provided. No props may be used. Selections should not be memorized. Poetry selections may be a combination of short poems on the same theme or by the same author OR they may be from a longer poetic piece. <u>Time limit: 7 minutes maximum, 30 second grace.</u>
- <u>Prose Reading:</u> Selections must be from a published source. Selections must possess literary merit (a plot and theme/moral) and be age-appropriate. An adequate introduction should be provided. No props may be used. Selections should not be memorized. Prose selections must be no more than 50% dialogue. <u>Time limit: 7 minutes maximum, 30 second grace.</u>

General Rules:

- Sweepstakes awards are presented for first, second, and third place. Awards for the Top 6 will be presented for all events.
- Failure to comply with these regulations will result in the elimination of that contestant. Fees are due for cancellations made after the deadline.
- Entry fee is \$5.00 per entry.

Sweepstakes Rules:

- A school's best two entries in each event earn sweepstakes points.
- 10 points qualify for finals
- 5 points 3rd place
- 10 points 2nd place
- 15 points 1st place
