Our tournament is entirely online this year and given the financial challenges posed by the COVID era we have waived school fees and reduced entry fees for this tournament. Ameena Amdahl-Mason is again directing our tab room.

We use Tabroom.com for tournament and participant registration (clark.tabroom.com) and will use NSDA Campus for online competition. Recording of rounds will not be supported by our tournament platform and the policy of the tournament is that no recording of any kind is permitted without the express consent of all parties to the round.

We will again be using electronic balloting for debate and IEs. Please ensure all judges and students have an account on Tabroom.com.

Uncovered judges

Debate: \$150 per judge needed (see below)

IEs: \$25 per entry Student Congress: \$25 per entry

Judging

One judge covers 2 CX policy entries, 2 parliamentary debate entries, or 2 Lincoln-Douglass/Public Forum debate entries. The <u>same</u> judge can cover up to 5 IE/Congress entries. Judges covering Congress can be used for debate, IEs, and Congress, barring conflicts.

We will use coaches as sparingly as possible until elimination rounds.

All schools must either cover judging obligations or let us know in advance so your fees can hire judges: Cover early or pay a fee.

Judges are obligated one round beyond the final round in which they have a student competing.

Registration

All registration through TabRoom.com using procedures detailed there.

Sweepstakes

Sweepstakes awards are calculated using the formula below. There will be a large and small school first, second and third. Teams below 50% of the average entry size are small schools.
