A Bill to Implement a Luxury Tax

- 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2 **SECTION 1**. Upon passage, this bill will implement a national luxury tax, adding a 10%
- 3 surcharge tax to "Luxury Items" as defined by Section 2 of this legislation.
- 4 **SECTION 2.** "Luxury Items" are defined as:
- 5 (A) Boats and water vehicles priced at \$300,000 or more
- 6 (B) Automobiles priced at \$90,000 or more
- 7 **(C)** Aircraft priced at \$750,000 or more
- 8 **(D)** Jewelry and clothing items priced at \$30,000 or more
- 9 **(E)** Real Estate priced at \$5,000,000 or more
- 10 **SECTION 3.** The Internal Revenue Service will oversee the implementation and
- 11 enforcement of the luxury tax.
- 12 **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall go into effect immediately upon passage.
- 13 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Resolution to Deploy US Ground Troops to Ukraine

RESOLVED, by the Congress here assembled that the United States shall deploy 50,000 ground troops to the Ukrainian region bordering Belarus and Russia.

A Resolution to Increase Mandated Police Training

whereas, over the last decade there has been increased awareness and debate regarding racially motived killings by police officers; and

WHEREAS, in many jurisdictions, police are woefully undertrained, sometimes graduating in as little as six weeks; and

WHEREAS, when undertrained, many police officers are left to make quick decisions based on fear rather than rational best practices; and

whereas, many experts believe that increased and more focused training could both reduce police violence and improve officer safety; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, by the Congress here assembled that all police departments must train new recruits for a minimum of 5 total years, 2 years off-duty and 3 years on-duty with an observer; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that officers must take further courses consisting of a minimum of 50 hours of racial bias training and a minimum of 50 hours of training on properly responding to people with disabilities and people under physical and mental duress.

- 2 **SECTION 1**. Ahead of each federal election, all registered voters in the United States
- 3 shall receive a \$50 voucher to be used for political donations.
- 4 **SECTION 2.** This legislation will be funded via an increase in the Federal Election
- 5 Commission's budget in Fiscal Year 2023.
- 6 **SECTION 3.** The Federal Election Commission shall be tasked with implementing this
- 7 legislation.
- 8 **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall go into effect for the 2024 federal election.
- 9 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

The Corporate Transparency and Accountability Act of 2022

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 SECTION 1. All corporations operating within the United States with an annual revenue of more than \$100 million must publicly disclose the 3 manufacturing or production location(s) of their goods and services and 4 5 any and all humanitarian risks posed to personnel based at such locations. This includes the manufacturing or production locations of 6 7 original design manufacturers. The corporation must release a publicly available report detailing such information at the end of each fiscal year. 8 **SECTION 2.** "Corporations operating within the United States" are defined as any 9 corporation headquartered in the United States. "Manufacturing or 10 11 production location(s)" are defined as the location at which a product is 12 prototyped, produced, or coded. "Goods and services" are defined as any 13 tangible or intangible products that corporations provide to customers (including, but not limited to, manufactured products, social media 14 platforms, or software). "Original design manufacturers" are defined as 15 third-party companies that produce a good or service that is rebranded 16 17 by the aforementioned corporation for sale. A "publicly available report" shall be defined as a report audited by a registered Certified Public 18 Accountant, made available on the website of the Consumer Financial 19 Protection Bureau (CFPB). 20

The Consumer Financial Protection Bureau shall be responsible for

2		overseeing and enforcing this legislation.
3	(A)	Any corporation that fails to submit this report in a timely manner shall
4		be fined 10% of their quarterly revenue for each quarter subsequent to
5		the end of the previous fiscal year.
6	(B)	The CFPB shall be responsible for creating a database on their website to
7		store and publicize the reports.

8 **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall go into effect in Fiscal Year 2023.

9 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
