### BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	SECTION 1.	The Chesapeake Bay restoration effort is unprecedented in scale and scope.
2		A saved Bay will provide an estimated \$130 billion annually in natural
3		resource benefits to the region and model a path for national and global
4		environmental restoration.
5	SECTION 2.	The Trump administration reversed dozens of clean air and water
6		regulations.
7	SECTION 3.	Multiple indicators of the Bay's health demonstrate substantial work is still
8		necessary.
9	SECTION 4.	Therefore, be it resolved by this Congress, the Environmental Protection
10		Agency will fund conservation measures for farmers in the Bay States
11		(Virginia, Maryland, Delaware, West Virginia, Pennsylvania, New York) and
12		Washington, D.C
13		A. The EPA will determine qualifications and fund's received
14		B. Bay farmers will apply for conservation funding
15	SECTION 5.	This legislation will take effect on July 1st, 2022. All laws in conflict with this

## A Bill to Include LGBTQ+ Voices in American Public Schools

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	<b>SECTION 1</b> .	The role of LGBTQ+ history in shaping American culture, including its
2		major political figures, activists, artists, and writers, is rarely given a
3		voice in American public school curricula, despite its significant
4		contributions to American culture and society. Likewise, the
5		contributions of major figures in the LGBTQ+ community are often
6		ignored, overlooked, or silenced.
7		This bill would require American public schools to include the historical 8
	signifi	cance of LGBTQ+ individuals and historical events as part of the
9		school curriculum to create a more inclusive environment for students.
10	SECTION 2.	"Voices" shall be defined as "the right of expression; influential power."
11		"LGBTQ+ shall be defined as "non-heterosexual or non-cisgender."
12	SECTION 3.	This bill will be put into effect and enforced by the U.S. Department of
13		Education.
14	<b>SECTION 4.</b>	This bill will go into effect immediately upon passage.
15	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and
16		void.

# A Bill to Prevent Future Damage to Ecosystems on the Colorado River by Controlling Water Held Back by Dams

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	<b>SECTION 1</b> .	A limit shall be enacted on both the water taken from the colorado river, and
2		the water held back from passing through the might colorado monthly to
3		assist the ecosystems and their respective habitats.
4	SECTION 2.	
5	A.	Held back shall be defined as water prevented from reaching the Colorado
6		River for any given time without at minimum 75% or maximum of 125% of
7		the amount of water being allowed to pass through.
8	В.	An extreme event shall be defined as any event that is projected to put
9		human life, or property at risk on a large scale.
10	SECTION 3.	This bill shall be enforced through the United States Environmental
11		Protection Agency.
12	A.	This 25% held back buffer shall be distributed along the Colorado River
13		dams as the EPA sees fit to accommodate dam filling, dam draining,
14		droughts, and other events that may occur to the dam.
15	В.	In case of any extreme events such as floods, droughts, or flash floods, this
16		buffer of 25% shall be increased to 50% to be spread out amongst the
17		Colorado River dams to allow for a minimum total of 50%, or a maximum
18		of 150% water held back from the river.
19	SECTION 4.	Implementation of this bill shall begin in the fiscal year 2025

# A Bill to Enforce Transparency in Capital Police Operations to Guarantee Citizen Safety

1	BE IT ENACTE	D BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2	<b>SECTION 1</b> .	Security information held by the United States Capitol Police must be released
3		to another entity, including an individual, in a manner pursuant to the
4		Freedom of Information Act (5 USC §552).
5	<b>SECTION 2</b> .	Security Information will be defined as in 2 U.S. Code § 1979: "information
6		that is sensitive with respect to the policing, protection, physical security,
7		intelligence, counterterrorism actions, or emergency preparedness and
8		response relating to Congress, any statutory protectee of the Capitol Police,
9		and the Capitol buildings and grounds; and is obtained by, on behalf of, or
10		concerning the Capitol Police Board, the Capitol Police, or any incident
11		command relating to emergency response."
12	SECTION 3.	The Department of Justice and Capitol Police Board will oversee the
13		enforcement of this legislation.
14	<b>SECTION 4.</b>	This legislation goes into effect immediately upon passage.

# A BILL TO EXPAND UPON EXISTING LIGHT RAIL CAPABILITIES IN WESTERN PENNSYLVANIA

In the Pennsylvania High School Speech League by Fox Chapel Area High School

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE PHSSL DISTRICT 16 SENATE THAT:

- Section I. The "Golden Triangle Railway" (GTR) will be established as a corporation owned entirely by the State of Pennsylvania initially.
- Section II. The GTR will provide for the construction of extensions to the existing Pittsburgh
  Light Rail System, the building of new stations along the extended lines, and the facilitation of
  transportation along these lines.
- Section III. The State of Pennsylvania will provide an initial investment to begin corporate function.
  - a.) A 2% increase in current tolls across state turnpikes is hereby authorized in order to raise funds for the GTR.
  - b.) \$6 billion will be allocated from the Pennsylvania State Budget to the GTR.
  - c.) The State Liquor Tax will be increased for a term of 10 years by 3% in order to raise funds for the GTR.
- Section IV. The GTR will, when the Secretary of Transportation deems appropriate, open itself for equity investment from private companies.
  - a.) The equity share of the State of Pennsylvania will never decrease below 50.1% of outstanding voting shares.
- 5. **Section V.** The Pennsylvania Department of Transportation will oversee the GTR, facilitate its growth, and manage it with the goal of high-functionality and greater transportation access.
- 6. **Section VI.** This bill will take effect immediately upon passage.
