Following are instructions for registering qualified students for Student Congress Metro Finals on Friday-Saturday, March 12-13. **Please adhere to deadlines** and other instructions carefully. In order to ensure that students have a reasonable amount of time to prepare for Metro Final competition; **exceptions to this schedule or deadlines cannot be made.**

REGISTRATION INFORMATION – ALL INFORMATION INCLUDING LEGISLATION MUST BE SUBMITTED BY THE COACH. PLEASE NOTE: THE STEPS ARE DIFFERENT FROM PRIOR YEARS.

1. Registration will require three steps: (1) Each qualified student must be entered by the coach into the tournament on Tabroom.com **by 7pm eastern on 2/25/2022**. The appropriate number of qualified judges must also be entered by the coach into the tournament on Tabroom.com. (2) Each qualified student must submit one piece of legislation for use in the Metro Final tournament. (3) In addition, each school must submit one piece of legislation to be considered for use. ***Coaches will upload legislation via Tabroom.com. It should not be emailed.***

All THREE steps above MUST BE COMPLETED BY THE DEADLINE in order for your students to be registered. Please ensure that your student's name and your school name are on the legislation. Only your school name should appear on the school legislation for the final round.

Judge Requirements. You will need one (1) judge (with experience judging at least **two** (2) WACFL Student Congresses) for every **three** (3) students or fraction thereof. Each school must assume that their judges will be judging any and all rounds.

2. Legislation may be on any topic of the student's choice. However, frivolous legislation, whether frivolous in topic choice or in treatment of a topic, will not be considered. In addition, **poorly written and incorrectly formatted legislation will not be selected.** The format for Bills and Resolutions must conform to that designated on the WACFL website; you must use the templates provided there (also available on the tournament Tabroom website). You must also use the legislation numbers designated on the WACFL website. When there are duplicate topics, the best legislation will be selected for consideration at the Metro Final tournament.

In Tabroom.com, after you enter a student into the tournament, you will see a "Legislation" tab. By clicking on that tab, you will be able to upload the legislation for each student. You will need to provide a piece of legislation for each student and indicate if the legislation is Domestic, Economic, or International. As the coach, you want to make sure the legislation from your school is distributed across all three (3) categories.

In order to upload the piece of school-provided legislation for the Final Sessions, please enter a student with the first name of "LEGISLATION" and last name of your school. Then when uploading the legislation, please indication the "School" category. **Legislation should be uploaded as PDFs. When uploading the PDF file in Tabroom, ensure the Legislation Title follows this naming format exactly (numbercolon title) — e.g., 1401: A Bill to Fix the Universe**

3. Metro Finals legislation will be posted on tabroom.com no later than the evening of Sunday, February 27th.
4. Call-ups, if any, for the Metro Final tournament will begin February 28th.
5. Drop deadline for students is **Tuesday, March 8th at 9:00pm**. Any drop reported after that date **does not** relieve a school of judging obligations nor of Metro Final entry fees.
6. There is a fee of \$10.00 per student regardless of the dues option that your school has chosen.

METROFINAL TOURNAMENT INFORMATION

Please note carefully the following information regarding procedures for the Metro Final Student Congress tournament.

1. **Please note that this is a two-day tournament for Arlington and one-day for Washington. Also, please note that actual registration numbers could create a need to change the actual session times on either day. As soon as we know from the registration numbers, we will let you know.**
2. **Please note that registration times are firm.** We will begin promptly. If you are not there, we will begin without you and **you will be dropped from the competition.** A copy of the complete Metro Final tournament schedule is included herein.
4. Please ensure that students have copies of each piece of legislation in advance of the tournament.
5. Students must participate in all sessions of the Metro Final tournament for which they qualify in order to be eligible for qualification to the Grand National tournament of the NCFL.
6. Tournament Format: see the planned schedule on the next page. Please note that actual registration numbers could create a need to change the actual session times on either day.
7. A seeding list determines who shall preside and who will be chairpersons of committees during the Metro Final tournament. Only those students with previous presiding officer experience this year will be eligible to act as presiding officers at the Metro Final tournament.
8. Students will not know their chamber assignments in advance to the competition. If students attempt to engage in pre-competition or pre-session communication in order to strategize how session activities will occur, our expectation is that these communication activities will be: (1) accessible to **ALL** who desire to participate; (2) conducted respectfully and in the spirit of collegial sportspersonship; and (3) inclusive of students from diverse backgrounds and identities.
9. **Six students from the Arlington Diocese and five students from the Washington Archdiocese** will qualify to the NCFL Grand National Tournament over Memorial Day weekend.
