

# 2022-2023 Rocket Season Blastoff Scrimmage Congressional Debate Legislation

## A Bill to Abolish the U.S. Drone Program

- 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2 **SECTION 1**. 1 Year from the passage of this legislation, there will be a complete end to
- the U.S. Drone Program and the usage of Drones as a military offensive in foreign
- 4 countries.
- 5 **SECTION 2.** The U.S. Drone Program is defined as: the program with a demonstrated
- and an enabled willingness to use lethal force in counterterrorism
- 7 operations through the usage of military grade drones.
- 8 **SECTION 3.** U.S Code § 357, 132 Stat. 3305 be revised to say: It is the policy of the
- 9 United States that the operation of any unmanned aircraft or unmanned aircraft system
- shall be carried out in a manner that respects and protects personal and foreign privacy
- consistent with the United States Constitution and Federal, State, and local law."
- SECTION 4. \$10 Billion in Department of Defense Funding shall be reallocated from
- the current Drone Program annual spending to a research project to innovate and
- discover new military offensive methods to replace the abrogated U.S. Drone Program.
- SECTION 5. The implementation of this legislation will be overseen by the Department
- of Defense, State Department, and the U.S. Ambassador to the United Nations.
- 17 **SECTION 6.** This legislation will take effect immediately. All laws in conflict with this
- legislation are hereby declared null and void.

# A Bill to Opt-in to Data Collection by Big Tech

	1	BE IT ENACT	ED BY THE	CONGRESS HERE	ASSEMBLED	THAT:

2	SECTION 1.	Companies that fall under the category of technology and sell personal
3		technology are hereby required to offer an opt in option to the devices
4		data collection practices.
5		A. Companies have one year from the passage of this legislation to implement
6		an opt in option for their consumers.
7		B. Companies that fail to do so will be fined \$1.5 million dollars per month
8 9	SECTION 2.	until an opt in option is provided to align with this legislation.  Personal technology is defined as a device and service that is used by a
10		single person as opposed to a family, business, or society.
11	SECTION 3.	The Federal Trade Commission (FTC) and Department of Commerce will
12		be responsible for the implementation and enforcement of this
13		legislation.
14	SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect immediately upon passage. All laws in conflict
15		with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

# **The Healthcare Reform Act of 2022**

1	BE IT ENACTE	D BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:		
2	SECTION 1. T	he United States shall hereby reform its healthcare system in the following		
3		ways to expand healthcare access:		
4		A. A public option healthcare system shall be established to increase		
5		healthcare coverage.		
6		<b>B.</b> \$1 billion dollars shall hereby be provided to rural areas to invest in		
7		hospital and medical infrastructure.		
8	SECTION 2.	"Public option" or public option insurance program shall be defined as a		
9		government-run healthcare plan that would compete against private		
10		insurers in individual market exchanges. "Hospital and medical		
11		infrastructure" will be defined as any resource that is necessary to the		
12		operation of a hospital, such as medical personnel, medicines, buildings,		
13		vehicles, and any other measure that is designed to bolster healthcare		
14		accessibility.		
15	SECTION 3.	The United States Department of Health and Human Services shall be		
16		tasked with the enforcement of this legislation.		
17		<b>A.</b> A premium of \$200 per month shall be established for the public		
18		option.		
19	SECTION 4.	This legislation shall take effect in FY 2024.		
20	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## A Bill to Provide Military Support to Taiwan

1	BF IT FNACTFD	<b>RY THF</b>	CONGRESS HERE	ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 2 **SECTION 1**. The United States shall create a military base in Taiwan to curb Chinese 3 military aggression. Companies have one year from the passage of this 4 legislation to implement an opt in option for their consumers.
- 5 **SECTION 2**. A budget of \$1 billion dollars shall be allocated. A military base shall be defined as a facility directly owned and operated by the military in order to store equipment, troops, and facilitate training exercises.
- 8 **SECTION 3.** The U.S. Department of Defense shall oversee the enforcement of this bill.
- 10 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect immediately upon passage. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
