#### IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENTS

We will be hosting the tournament at James Logan High School located at 1800 H Street, Union City, CA 94587. Public parking is located on H Street, across the street from the James Logan Performing Arts Center adjacent to the swim complex & basketball courts. Please do not arrive on campus before 3:45 PM on Friday, January 13 and before 7:00 AM on the weekend.

To ensure the safety of our attendees, we will be following all local/state ordinances regarding the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic. While they are not required, masks are strongly encouraged in all competition and communal spaces.

We will continue to run the tournament on Tabroom.com (<u>www.mlk.tabroom.com</u>) this year. All students and judges must be linked to their school via Tabroom.com prior to the competition. Coaches can review the <u>Linking Students to Tabroom</u> document for assistance.

#### **CROSS ENTRY**

The tournament allows cross-entry in one (1) Debate event and up to three (3) speech events.



Cross-entry between Speech & Debate events are allowed, however, **students entering in Congress** may not cross-enter to compete in any other event.

Triathlete competitors, or students who have entered in 3 speech events, are eligible for the annual competition awarded to the top 3 performers in the entire tournament. A donation will be made on behalf of the 3 triathlete award winners who will get to elect a social justice nonprofit organization for a donation in their name.

#### **DIVISION**

The MLK tournament is a **varsity** competition in all events. Coaches must only enter students who are competing at the varsity level in their events. We cannot accept any independent entries at this time. All competing students must represent a registered high school. **Any student competitors found in violation of this will be immediately disqualified from the competition.** 

We are not able to accept Middle School competitors this year. There is no middle school competition. Please do not enter middle school students into the tournament.

#### **REGISTRATION EVENT CAPS**

If needed to uphold the integrity of competition and ensure a fair break, we may implement an entry cap per school in all events to balance the overall entry.

**Debate** events - 7 entries

Speech events - 15 entries per event

Congress - 15 entries

Any entries greater than these caps will remain on the waitlist. Further entries per school will be admitted if space allows by January 4, 2023.

Coaches can claim "TBA" slots in Tabroom. All entries will be waitlisted and cleared once names are registered. **Competitor names must be added by January 4**, **2023**. Waitlisted entries beyond this date will be cleared once space becomes available. Coaches will be notified if waitlisted entries have cleared up until Monday, January 9, 2023.

#### **EVENT RULES**

We will adhere to NSDA rules (section 2 of High School Manual) for all national circuit events: this includes Lincoln Douglas, Public Forum, Policy, DI, Duo, HI, Info, IX, NX, OO, and POI.



We will be following CHSSA rules & regulations for all California state events which include Parliamentary Debate, IMP, OI, OA, and OPP.

Congressional Debate rules and regulations are posted in the Congress packet available on Tabroom.

If there are questions or concerns that arise regarding the rules during rounds, please have a coach submit the form to the Equity Committee within ninety (90) minutes of the conclusion of the round, or prior to the conclusion of the next round - whichever comes first.

## **DATES & DEADLINES**

### Friday, December 16, 2022

- → Recommended registration deadline for all events is due by 11:59 PM PST.
- → Please input competitors names into Tabroom by this date to be cleared off the waitlist.
- → This is also the deadline to request hired judges.

### Wednesday, January 4, 2023

→ Registration deadline. All TBA slots will be dropped after this point.

### Friday, January 6, 2023

- → All registration payments must be RECEIVED no later than this date. If your registration is not received by this deadline, your team's entries will be immediately dropped.
- → The DROP DEADLINE for this year's tournament by 11:59 PM PST.
- → Any drops made after this deadline will incur the full registration fee penalty for that event.
- → <u>ALL FEES WILL BE FROZEN ON THIS DATE</u>. Drops after this date will not be refunded. Any outstanding fees owed will need to be taken care of prior to the start of the tournament.

## Monday, January 9, 2023

- → Judge registration deadline at 11:59 PM PST.
- → Waitlisted entries to the tournament will be cleared by this date and coaches will be contacted. Teams not cleared by this date will have little to no chance of being entered into the tournament.




## **TOURNAMENT LOGISTICS**

#### **REGISTRATION PAYMENT**



We request that all payments be made electronically via our website:

<u>www.jamesloganforensics.org/mlk</u>. Credit card payments will be processed through Squarespace. Once payment is submitted you will receive a confirmation email. Tournament Directors will update the Fees tab in your Tabroom account with confirmed payment or with remaining balance.

All payments are made as a donation to the James Logan Forensics nonprofit, **Friends of Forensics** (Tax ID: 94-3228131). If requested by your school administration, please download the <u>Friends of Forensics W-9 Form</u>.

Please contact Tournament Directors if your school is only able to make payment via check. Checks must be received in the mail by January 6, 2023. *Absolutely no personal checks will be accepted.* 

#### **FEE WAIVERS**

As a Title I public school, we understand that fundraising efforts can be difficult. As always, we want to support competitors and their programs as best we can. If applicable, complete the <u>MLK Financial Assistance Request</u> by **January 2**, **2023**. #### **ONLINE REGISTRATION**

On Friday, January 13, 2023 electronic registration will be automated for schools who do not have outstanding fees or necessary drops. For those schools with outstanding fees and/or late drops, registration will take place between 9:00-11:00 AM PST via the Tab Room. We request that schools competing in only speech events still register during this time slot.

#### JUDGING REQUIREMENT

There will be dedicated judge pools based on events this year. Judges will need to be registered in one of the following pools: Policy, LD/PF/Parli, Congress, or Speech. There will not be a cross-entry option between judge categories to ensure an on-time tournament, allow single-flighted debate rounds when possible, and prioritize judge mental health.

All judge names must be entered and linked in Tabroom.com to cover entries. We are planning on pre-paneling rounds and posting judge obligations the day before the tournament. Uncovered round fines will be strictly enforced this year, so please make sure that your judging commitments are fulfilled throughout the entire tournament schedule. We reserve the right to use any and all judges for ANY event offered at the tournament, in order to ensure that we stay on schedule.



We are asking that all parent and community judges complete the <u>free Cultural Competency Judge Training</u> offered by the NSDA to better the experience for all competitors.

As always, we request coaches nominate Elimination judges in all events. This can be done when entering judges in Tabroom or by contacting tournament officials. We strongly encourage coaches to judge on behalf of their programs for all Sunday elimination rounds. Inexperienced judges may not be used on Sunday at the discretion of the tournament.

Hiring judges may be extremely limited this year. We hope that all schools will be able to meet their judge burden.

#### Some Judging reminders:

- Please have judges create their own Tabroom account using their own email accounts. We will only accept the real names of each judge.
- Please have judges enter their CELL PHONE number on their tabroom accounts as we will use this number to send text reminders throughout the tournament.
- Please ensure that your judges can stay for their entire commitment. We do not allow judges to judge under any name but their own.
- If a judge does not get an assignment for two rounds in a row, please have them check in with the judge lounge for support.
- We especially need judges committed to the back-to-back debate outrounds starting on Saturday night to ensure that they go smoothly and the tournament stays on time.
