All Speech & Debate Programs throughout Utah, and surrounding States if interested are invited to attend.

Each team/program will be able to register through tabroom.com following the link which will have all posted entry fees based on the number of students attending from that particular school for in person with asynchronous opportunities.

Fees

-\$25.00 per school to enter for debate

-\$25.00 per school to enter for speech/IE

-\$4.00 per student per event

-\$8.00 per PF/CX or other team per event

-\$25.00 Nuisance fine for drops after January 24th

**No Show Judges will incur \$25 fine on behalf of their school for each prelim round missed and \$30 if it is an elimination/final round. **

(We will be using Tabroom for online balloting, so please make sure your judges have a linked account, and they bring a device to use! All judges must be high school graduates! NO varsity student judges. Judges can be double entered; for example, a debate judge could also then be either an asynchronous or synchronous speech judge.)

Please plan on bringing 1 judge for every 2 LD/BQ/WS entries, 1 judge for every 2 policy/PF teams, 1 judge for every 5 speech or asynchronous entries, and 1 judge for every 5 Congress entries. ***Due to the unique nature of single-fighting Varsity LD and PF, any schools without their full judge compliment will have their LD and PF entries receive a Bye-Loss for every round we are short judges. Example, a school with 3 entries is required to have 2 judges, but if they only bring 1 judge. One of their entries (not all three) will receive a "Bye-Loss" for every round we are short judges.***

There will be individual awards for all competitors who make elimination rounds in each category of competition. Team sweepstakes will be based on entry size with top three receiving awards for both large & small schools respectively.

All Congress Legislation and Extemporaneous topics will be posted three weeks before the tournament start date to allow competitors proper time to prepare.

Concessions will be sold both Friday & Saturday, with food from local restaurants along with an assortment of treats, snacks, and drinks. All food and drink will only be allowed in the commons and cafeteria areas. Coaches & judges will be fed in the faculty lounge on both days during dinner and lunch.

Unique Events:

News Anchor: In this event competitors present the news (real or fictional) as a news anchor or news anchor team. The news can be presented in a serious nature if you choose. However, satirical news presentations in the vein of Steven Colbert, John Stewart and Saturday Night Live are preferred. 5-10 minutes. As this is asynchronous this year, you may screen share images as part of your performance. Content must be school appropriate.

Poetry: Competitors can alternate between poetry and prose, but it is not required. They can do the same poetry piece or prose all three rounds. Pieces should be 5-7 minutes long.

Declamation: This is a 5-10 minute speech given in a public setting by a prominent individual.

Thank you for participating and joining us to compete and have fun. All money raised will be utilized to provide our team/program with the opportunity to travel and compete out of state this year as we continue to seek out opportunities to expand our speech & debate skills.
