Legislation #1: A Bill to Ban Zoos

- **SECTION 1.** The United States Federal Government shall ban all zoos in the United States.
- **SECTION 2.** Zoo is defined as "a facility with usually indoor and outdoor settings where living, typically wild animals are kept for public exhibition."
- **SECTION 3.** Wildlife that can survive in the wild will be released into their natural habitats. All remaining wildlife currently kept in zoos will be moved to sanctuaries and rescue facilities.
- **SECTION 4.** This bill will be enforced by the US Department of Agriculture.
- **SECTION 5.** This legislation shall go into effect on January 1st, 2028.
- **SECTION 6.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Legislation #2: A Bill to Increase NASA Funding

- SECTION 1. The United States shall double the funding of the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) from \$25.4 Billion USD to \$50 Billion USD for the purpose of the administration's goal of human exploration.
- **SECTION 2.** "Human Exploration" shall be defined as expanding human presence into the solar system and to the surface of Mars to advance exploration, science, innovation, benefits to humanity, and international collaboration.
- **SECTION 3.** The Implementation of this bill shall be overseen by the U.S. Department of the Interior.
 - A. The additional \$24.6 Billion in funds shall be diverted from the United States Defense Budget.
- **SECTION 4.** This law shall go into effect in the beginning of Fiscal Year of 2025.
- **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Legislation #3: A Bill to Tax Fast Food

- **Section 1.** The United States Federal Government will put a sales tax on all fast food.
- **Section 2.** "Fast food" is defined as mass-produced food sold in a restaurant or store with frozen, preheated or precooked ingredients and served in packaging for take-out/take-away. Examples of fast food include McDonald's, Burger King, and Wendy's.
- **Section 3.** There will be a 15% sales tax on any food that is considered "fast food." 50% of the revenues collected will be used to subsidize community health clinics and food banks.
- **Section 4.** This bill will be implemented and enforced by the US Department of Health and Human Services.
- **Section 5.** This legislation will take effect January 1st 2025.
- **Section 6.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Finals Legislation: A Bill to Construct Wildlife Crossings

- **Section 1.** The United States shall build 2,000 new wildlife crossings through all 50 states by 2028, with focus on areas with high populations of endangered terrestrial species.
- **Section 2.** Wildlife crossings will be defined as an underpass or overpass constructed in relation to a multi-lane highway that is covered in vegetation to allow for safe animal crossings.
- **Section 3.** The Department of the Interior and the Department of Transportation will oversee the construction of these crossings.
 - A. The Department of Transportation will oversee the construction of these crossings.
 - B. The Fish and Wildlife Service will ensure that the crossings have the components necessary to be safe for wildlife.
- **Section 4.** Construction will begin on January 1, 2024 and will be completed by December 31, 2027.
- **Section 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
