## A Bill to Protect the India-Pakistan Border

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	SECTION 1.	The US will support 3 billion dollars expansions of	
2	counter-narcotics and counter-terrorism operations on the Pakistan-Indian		
3	border. over the next five years. The US will also spur trilateral engagement		
4	between India	an and Pakistan, with the hopes of also engaging Afghanistans	
5	narcotic and t	errorism threats as well.	
6	SECTION 2.	Counter-terrorism operations shall be defined as military	
7	training, arms	sales, and coordination between militaries to interdict the	
8	movement of organizations and individuals designated as terrorists.		
9	Counter-narcotics shall be defined as efforts to limit the trafficking of		
10	narcotics across borders and the farming of poppy.		
11	SECTION 3.	The Department of State and USAID shall be in charge of	
12	enforcing this legislation.		
13	SECTION 4.	This legislation will go into effect in FY 2022	
14	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared	
15	null and void.

10		official policy	to a vote of confidence, endorsing a public referendum where	
11		the people of	Afghanistan will vote to choose their leadership.

1	SECTION 1.	The Coast Guard shall be allocated 2 billion dollars over the		
2	next five years for research and development; repair; and construction of			
3	new arctic cu	new arctic cutters.		
4	SECTION 2.	The grants will be allocated between the above sections by		
5	the Coast Gu	ard Polar Cutter Security Program. At least 50% of the funds		
6	must be allocated towards construction of new ships.			
7	SECTION 3.	The Department of Defense and Coast Guard will enforce		
8	this legislatio	n.		
9	A. Congress	will receive annual updates regarding the status of each policy		
10	annually			
11	SECTION 4.	This legislation will go into effect in FY 2022		
12	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared		
13	null and void
