

A Bill to Save the Bees to Prevent Extinction of the Human Race

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- **SECTION 1.** All citizens of the United states that will start bee farms with bees native to North America will be given a \$1100 grant to start at least 3 hives.
- SECTION 2. Bees native to the United States are: sweat bees, bumble bees, long-horned bees, and miner bees.
- **SECTION 3.** The United States Department of Agriculture will oversee the enforcement of this bill.
- **SECTION 4.** This bill will go into effect July 2023.
- **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Resolution to Amend the Constitution to Establish an Age Limit for Federal Office Holders and Judges

1	RESOLVED,	By two-third	s of the Congress here assembled, that the following article is
2		proposed as	an amendment to the Constitution of the United States, which shall
3		be valid to al	l intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when ratified by
4		the legislatur	es of three-fourths of the several states within seven years from the
5		date of its su	bmission by the Congress:
6			ARTICLE
7		SECTION 1:	No candidate for election to the U.S. Congress, Presidency, or
8			federal judicial appointment will be permitted to assume office if
9			he or she has reached the age of 80 on or before the date of
10			swearing in.
11		SECTION 2:	The Congress shall have the power to enforce this article by
12			appropriate legislation.

A Bill to Legalize Physician Assisted Suicide

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	SECTION 1 . United States citizens 18 and over may receive help from a
2	physician to commit suicide. The citizen who is wanting to commit suicide
3	shall visit a physician who is qualified to assist in said suicide.
4	SECTION 2. A qualified physician is deemed qualified when they finish
5	their medical training in school. Suicide assist will be implemented and
6	mandatory to learn in order to graduate from med school.
7	SECTION 3. The <i>US Department of State</i> and the <i>National Institutes of</i>
8	Health will oversee this legislation.
9	A. Should a US citizen commit suicide without the help of a physician, 20%
10	of the inheritance will be taken and put to use in funding this piece of
11	legislation.
12	B. Before the physician is allowed to assist in suicide, the citizen must take
13	a test and sign a waiver proving that they are sane and are sure they
14	want to go through with the suicide as well as getting approval from a
15	psychiatrist and/or a therapist stating that they have done everything
16	in their power to rehabilitate said citizen.
17	SECTION 4. This legislation will take effect one year after the passing. All
18	laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Recall U.S. Forces and Promote Peace Abroad

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- Section 1. The United States of America will hereby not be involved in armed conflicts.
- 2 Furthermore, The United States will hereby not intervene in armed conflicts
- 3 between other nations. All United States' forces will return to American jurisdiction.
- 4 Section 2. American jurisdiction is defined as land the United States controls and/or owns.
- 5 U.S. Forces are defined as military personnel in any of the six service branches.
- 6 **Section 3.** The Executive Branch will enforce the Bill.
- 7 **Section 4.** This legislation will take effect on July 1, 2023. All laws in conflict with this legislation
- 8 are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Continue the Emergency Rental Assistance Program to Continue to Assist Households that are unable to Pay Rent

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. The Federal Government will continue funding the emergency rental assistance program.

SECTION 2. The Emergency Rental Assistance program makes funding available to assist households that are unable to pay rent or utilities. Two separate programs have been established: ERA1 provides up to \$25 billion under the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021, which was enacted on December 27, 2020, and ERA2 provides up to \$21.55 billion under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, which was enacted on March 11, 2021. The funds are provided directly to states, U.S. territories, local governments, and (in the case of ERA1) Indian tribes. Grantees use the funds to provide assistance to eligible households through existing or newly created rental assistance programs.

SECTION 3. The United States Federal Housing and Urban Development will oversee the enforcement of this bill. Funds will be allocated through the Treasury Department.

SECTION 4. This legislation will take effect in January 2023. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Hire More Social Workers Within The Foster System

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1 **SECTION 1**. The United States Foster Care System will be placed under the Public Health
- 2 Service Commissioned Corps. The Allocation of funds through the Public Health Service
- 3 Commissioned Corps will be combined with Funds Allocated to the American Foster Care
- 4 System.

- 6 **SECTION 2**. This will be overseen by The United States Children's Bureau.
 - A. Public Health Service Commissioned Corps
 - B. This will be used to perpetually increase the number of social workers in the Foster System by 30%.
- 10 C. Every 5 years until this is achieved the number of Social workers in the 11 Foster care system is expected to rise by 10%.
- 12 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect January 1, 2025. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

2	SECTION 1.	The US Secretary of Education shall establish an "Addressing Teacher Shortages	
3		Program" for eligible entities.	
4	SECTION 2. D	DEFINITIONS:	
5	(a) ELIGI	BLE ENTITY- A local educational agency or school district that serves a low income	
6	popul	ation in a rural area.	
7	(b) QUAL	IFIED MENTOR TEACHER- An educator who meets the State-determined requirement	
8	for te	acher effectiveness and an aptitude for mentorship.	
9	SECTION 3. A	DDRESSING THE TEACHER SHORTAGE	
10	(a) ADDRESSING THE TEACHER SHORTAGE PROGRAM ESTABLISHED-		
11	(1) GRANTS AUTHORIZED-	
12		A. From amounts made available to carry out this Act, the Secretary shall establish	
13		an Addressing Teacher Shortages Program, through which the Secretary shall	
14		award grants, on a competitive basis, to eligible entities, to enable the entities	
15		to carry out activities described in subsection B in continuous consultation with	
16		the schools served by the eligible entity.	
17		B. The Eligible Entities that are awarded these grants must commit to one or more	
18		of the following:

A Bill to Invest in Mental Health Education

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	SECTION 1.	A grant of \$10,000 will be available to Title 1 K-12 public schools in order to
2		invest in improved mental health programs, suicide awarness, emergency
3		cousling services, and qulified conseling staff.
4		
5	SECTION 2.	Definitions are provided by the Merriam Webster Dictionary:
6		Title 1: A federal education program that supports low income students
7		throughout the nation.
8		Counselling Services: a collaborative effort between the counselor and
9		client.
10		Qualified conseling staff: person employed as such to provide
11		psychological, counselling or pastoral welfare to students.
12		Suicide Awarness: A proactive effort to raise awareness around suicidal
13		behaviors.
14		Mental Health Programs: A treatment, prevention, rehabilitation, or
15		educational service offered by a community mental health center or other
16		entity for the purpose of maintaining or improving the mental health of an
17		individual or community.
18		
19	SECTION 3.	The U.S Department of Education:
20		The U.S. Department of Education will distribute the funds and then lead
21		follow up inspections in the schools. In order to do this the Department of
22		Eduction will need to be given more spread out areas of operations and an
23		increased workforce. They will be given offices in each county and an
24		increased workforce of 10,000 personnel.

26	SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect on July 1, 2023. All laws in conflict with this
