League staff will send text/email blasts via Tabroom, but timely receipt cannot be guaranteed.
Failure to receive a blast is NOT an excuse for missing a round!***

Notes

- Pairings and blasts will be released approximately 10-15 minutes before each round (5 minutes before Extemp draw). Judges and contestants who do not receive a blast should check their Tabroom dashboards or the **publicly available** online pairings <<https://fgccfl.net/home/pairings/>>.
- There is a 15 minute forfeit rule in effect for all events. After 15 minutes, any late-arriving entry will not be permitted to compete, and any missing judge will be replaced (with a fine). Late arrivals to Extemp Prep may draw but are required to speak at their scheduled time or forfeit the round.
- Judges are expected to open their electronic ballots upon arriving in the round. This lets the Tab Room know that you have accepted the assignment. **Judges who cannot access their ballots should come back to the Tab Room to get paper ballots BEFORE starting the round.**
- Judges are expected to submit and confirm their ballots (decision and speaker points in debate; ranks and points in IE; ranks in Congress) within 15 minutes after the end of the round. While judges, especially in Congress, should write the bulk of their comments on the electronic ballot during the round, they may add or edit comments until the end of the tournament.
