# **Legislative Calendars**

The calendars below are preset and **may not** be changed, **except** that if the Session 1 PO's legislation is scheduled for debate in Session 1, it may be dropped to the bottom of the chamber's calendar.

If a chamber exhausts its calendar for one session, it should begin debating the legislation for the next session in calendar order.

Once an item of legislation is brought to the floor for debate, it **may not** be considered in that chamber in any subsequent session. Legislation on the Session 1 calendar **may not** be debated in Session 2.

## **Debate Time Limit**

The time limit in both chambers is **60 minutes** per B/R. No extensions are permitted beyond 60 minutes, but the chamber is not required to use the full time. The previous question is in order at any time following the authorship speech.
