As coaches, **YOU** have so many details **YOU** must take care of if you want your students to be able to compete in this tournament. The committee cannot and will not allow a school to enter and compete if the requirements have not been met.

The Arizona NSDA District Committee is pleased to invite you to this year's national qualifying tournament. We look forward to your participation in one of the most exciting and the most important tournaments of the year, and we eagerly anticipate the selection of the finest slate of competitors to represent our state at the **NSDA National Tournament.** 

## Again this year:

The NSDA is again offering entry to the National tournament in multiple supplemental events to two non-qualifying students from each team. This year, they are not required to have competed at the AZ District Tournament.

**PLEASE** bring as many entries, in both Congress and the District Qualifier, that your team is allotted. We automatically qualify 3 entries in each event if we meet the minimum entries required. If we exceed 50 entries in any event, we will qualify a 4th competitor in that event. This can be the most exciting of tournaments because we never know who will qualify. I have personally qualified freshman and novices in almost all of the events. **Coaches, we have an obligation to keep the dream alive. Please never tell them, "It isn't worth going, because you won't qualify."**

#### AZNSDA DISTRIST TOURANMENT EVENT INFORMATION

#### **JUDGE QUOTA**

- 1. **Congress:** You must supply 1 qualified judge for every 5 congressional debate entries. You need to have your obligation covering the entire day. The more people we have who can PO, the better.
- 2. **Debate:** You are required to bring 1 qualified / experienced judge for every 1 debater/team entered, sort of. On Thursday (LD, PF, & BQ) and Friday (LD, PF, BQ, & Policy), you have to bring 1 judge for every 2 debaters/teams, BUT on Saturday, you have to bring 1 judge for every 1 debater/team entered. That means if you have 4 LDers, you MUST bring 2 judges on Thursday, 2 on Friday, and 4 on Saturday even if all your kids are out of the tournament. Tabroom is incapable of letting us set it up this way, so you will always appear to be short on Debate judges on Thursday and Friday. I will be watching and reach out when there is a shortage.
- 3. **Individual Events:** You are required to bring 1 judge for every 3 individual events entries.

#### **CONGRESSIONAL DEBATE:**

- 1. All legislation MUST be uploaded to the Tabroom website by Wednesday, March 1, 2023, at 8:00 p.m.
- 2. The legislation packet will be available on the Tabroom site no later than Monday, March 6, 2023, at 8:00 p.m. provided you do your part and get them in on time and in the correct format. This is a full 3 weeks prior to the tournament.
- 3. All legislation must be of a **legitimate / serious nature and that would fall under Federal jurisdiction.**
- 4. We will NOT retype any legislation. All legislation must meet the format as set forth in the Competition Events Guide see link below. The legislation MUST be in **Word format**, double spaced, in 10 or 12 point font, and **NOT longer than ONE page. We will not accept any legislation that is typed in a TABLE or that is a PDF.** The NSDA approved templates for bills and resolutions are available on the website.

#### **ORATORY and INFORMATIVE:**

- 1. Please submit Oratory and Informative Titles on Tabroom.
- 2. Additionally, students who compete in Oratory and Informative **MUST** upload a copy of their speech(es) plus works cited page to the <u>www.turnitin.com</u> website by **Thursday, March 22<sup>nd</sup>**. If your students have never used Turnitin.com, please <u>click this link for complete instructions.</u>
  - a. **To upload an ORATORY:** Use the Class ID: **37812864** with the Enrollment key: AZOO2023 (Take notice that the Enrollment keys are all caps and no space).
  - b. **To upload an INFORMATIVE**: Use the Class ID: 37813434 with the enrollment key: AZINF2023 (Take notice that the Enrollment keys are all caps and no space).

#### **INTERP SELECTIONS: DI, HI, POI, & DUO:**

- 1. Please enter all of your interp information on Tabroom.
- 2. In order to prove you have not "Frankensteined" a script, you must submit 2 copies of your interp script. See instructions below.
- 3. Create a **Google Folder by March 22<sup>nd</sup>**. Label the folder Interp plus school name ie. (Interp-Mountain View) & share it with Meg Howell-Haymaker.
- 4. Upload all of your interp scripts to this one folder by March  $22^{nd}$ .

- 5. **FIRST COPY OF SCRIPT:** You **MUST** scan and upload to the folder a **photocopy of the original interp selection (not a typed copy)** with the cutting highlighted.
  - a. All added words for transition purposes, MUST be noted on the script in the margin where they occur.
  - b. Make sure to include a copy of the **title page**, the **copyright page with ISBN number highlighted** and the **table of contents** if there is one.
  - c. If the selection comes from a novel or a longer literary work, **only copy the pages that contain lines** used in the students cutting.
  - d. Also, make sure to put the student's name, event and school on the front page. For POI include a complete Works Cited page of every literary selection used in the program
- 6. **SECOND COPY OF SCRIPT:** You **MUST** also scan a **typed copy of the performance script** that has the **page numbers** (where the line came from in the original script) indicated in the margin if the lines or portions of a line are not in the same order in the script. Make sure the student's name is on the script.
