- Grading/Judging
- Coaches of most Academics events are asked to help grade tests following their contests. This will make the tournament run more smoothly and conclude in a timely manner.

- Start Times for Events
- Debate will begin promptly at 8:00 AM. Schools not registered by 7:40 AM shall forfeit the first round.
- The Number Sense and Copy Editing tests will begin promptly at 8:00 AM. Late arrivals will be disqualified.
- Parking
- All buses are requested to park in the student parking lot directly north of the school.
- Concessions

## Rules and Restrictions

- Contestants
- All students must remain in the cafeteria unless competing.

- Smoking or use of any illegal substance on campus will result in disqualification.
