A Resolution to Amend the Constitution for Term Limits

- 1. Whereas, corruption has only increased and continued to be exposed within the federal
- 2. legislative branch of the government.
- 3. Whereas, the legislative branch, The House of Representatives and The Senate, are in
- 4. charge of making and passing every American bill and resolution but their credibility has
- 5. been lost to corruption.
- 6. **Whereas,** without the credibility of a branch of government, it can not be accepted that the
- 7. bills and resolutions are in the best interest of the American people and its allies.
- 8. Be it resolved that the Constitution shall be amended to add the following:
- "Senators will only be allowed two consecutive terms twelve years, and the House of
 Representatives will only be allowed two consecutive terms four Years, before
 relinquishing their seat for a term before being allowed reelection"
- This amendment will be sent to the states by a two-thirds vote. The amendment must then be ratified by three-fourths of the State legislatures, or three-fourths of conventions called in each State for ratification.

A Bill to Set a Maximum Cost of College Attendance

- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2. SECTION 1. All public colleges will institute a ceiling on the cost of attendance of \$30,000 per year.
- A. The Department of Education may approve yearly increases which may not exceed
- 4. the annual rate of inflation as measured by the consumer price index.
- 5. SECTION 2. Cost of attendance includes, tuition, fees, room and board.
- 6. SECTION 3.The Department of Education will oversee the implementation of this bill.
- 7. A. Schools which fail to adhere to this ceiling shall not receive Federal loans or grants.
- 8. SECTION 4. Implementation of the bill will begin with the 2024-2025 academic year.
- 9. SECTION 5.All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Limit Diplomatic and Military Relations with the Philippines to Protect Human Rights

- BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- **SECTION 1**. The United States will suspend all military activities in conjunction with,
- or to the sole benefit of the Philippines. Diplomatic relations will be reduced to a minimal
- level that still allows communication and influence with the Philippines. Any diplomatic
- 5 preferential treatment shall be discontinued. These curtailments shall remain in effect until
- the Department of State determines that the government of the Philippines no longer is a
- 7 significant violator of human rights.
- **SECTION 2.** Military activities are defined as, but not limited to, training, running of
- 9 military exercises, supplying military materials, and presence of military advisors. Complete
- removal of military personnel is not required but is allowed as determined by the Department
- of Defense. Diplomatic relations are defined as those involving embassies, consulates and
- their personnel in communicating and collaborating between countries.
- SECTION 3. The Department of Defense will coordinate the reduction of military
- activities. The Department of State will coordinate the reduction of diplomatic relations
- **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect immediately upon passage.
- **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
