#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	SECTION 1.	Justices on the Supreme Court of the United States will be limited to
2		serving on the Court until they turn the age of 70. Following a Justice's
3		reaching the age of 70, they will no longer be considered a Justice and the

		Senate will confirm a new Justice to replace them.
5	SECTION 2.	Age limits can be defined as an age upon which a Supreme Court Justice
6		can no longer serve on the Court.
7	SECTION 3.	Enforcement of this bill will be overseen by the Department of Justice.
8		A. However, a significant amount of enforcement is not necessary, as
9		there is no way for Supreme Court Justices to resist the expiration of
10		their terms.
11	SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2024. All laws in conflict with
12		this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

### A Bill to Aid European Nations in Countering Rising Russian Aggression

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	SECTION 1. The United States Federal Government shall take a three-prong approach
2	to assist European nations in their efforts to counter Russian aggression in Ukraine.
3	A. The US Department of Defense shall provide 25 billion dollars in advanced military
4	aid to European nations under potential threat.
5	a. The nations that shall receive this aid are as follows: Finland, Estonia, Latvia,
6	Lithuania, Poland, and Georgia.
7	b. The exact weapons and equipment provided shall be decided upon further
8	analysis by the Congressional subcommittee in coordination with the
9	militaries of the aforementioned nations.
10	B. The US Department of Aid shall provide 5 billion dollars in humanitarian aid to
11	Ukraine.
12	C. The US shall authorize increased oil and natural gas drilling by 25% and this oil will
13	be made available for purchase by European nations.
14	a. Oil companies will be offered incentives to sell to Western European nations.
15	These incentives will be decided upon by the bipartisan subcommittee.
16	SECTION 2. The following definitions shall be offered:
17	A. Advanced military aid shall be defined as US military equipment that offers
18	significant advancement of the target nation's military capabilities within limits
19	imposed by the US Department of Defense.
20	B. Humanitarian aid shall be defined as support to nations affected by the ongoing
21	conflict in Ukraine to offer sustainable living conditions to Ukrainian refugees.
22	SECTION 3. The bipartisan Congressional subcommittee shall be formed to work in
23	coordination with the U.S. Department of Defense, US Department of Aid, and US
24	Department of State along with the governments and militaries of the target nations to
25	oversee the implementation of this legislation.
26	SECTION 4. This bill shall go into effect immediately upon implementation

	void.

# A Bill to Expand the National Instant Criminal Background Check System (NICS)

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 2. A. Congress shall authorize the Federal Bureau of Investigations (FBI) to include the
- 3. following records in it's National Instant Criminal Background Check System (NICS)

- 5. i. Records of outpatient mental health commitments.
- 6. ii. Records of interactions with police forces regarding mental health.
- 7. iii. Medical records of any mental illness characterized by harm or threat of

- 9. **SECTION 2:** For the purposes of this bill:
- 10. A. Outpatient mental health commitments are to be defined as a mandated treatment by
- 11. civil or criminal courts for a diagnosed mental illness.
- 12. B. Interactions with police forces is to be defined as an interaction with law enforcement
- 13. agents including, but not limited to, traffic stops, mental health checkups, home visits,
- 14. 911 calls, and others.
- 15. C. Mental illness characterized by harm is to be defined as a Serious Mental Illness by the
- 16. National Institute for Mental Health.
- 17. D. Records and Medical Records are to be defined as any official document collected by a
- 18. law enforcement agency, medical institution, or criminal or civil court.
- 19. SECTION 3: Enforcement of this legislation shall be overseen by the FBI.
- 20. SECTION 4: This bill shall go into effect one month after its passage.
- 21. SECTION 5: All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

#### A BILL TO LIMIT THE INFLUENCE OF THE BRICS ALLIANCE

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- SECTION 1. A 10% tariff increase will be imposed upon goods imported to the United States from Brazil, Russia, India, China, and South Africa, in order to condemn the BRICS alliance and discourage their increasing global influence.
- SECTION 2. A. The BRICS alliance will be defined as the geopolitical alliance between economic superpowers Brazil, Russia, India, China, and South Africa.

  B. Imported goods mainly include, but are not limited to, crude and refined petroleum, coal, wood, soybeans, precious metals, machinery and electrical equipment, iron, and steel.
  - C. Trade with other countries, especially countries in the Global South that the U.S. is not yet allied with through NATO or otherwise, will be prioritized.
- **SECTION 3.** The Office of Foreign Assets Control under the US Department of the Treasury will oversee the enforcement of this legislation.
- **SECTION 4.** This legislation will go into effect the first of January of the following year.
- SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this bill are hereby declared null and void.

11	SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2024.
