Bill #251: A Bill to Regulate PFAS in Water

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

| 1 | SECTION 1. | A bill to end the production of water-polluting PFAS by 2025. |

| 3 | | PFAS is defined as Per- and Polyfluorinated Substances. |
| 4 | | EPA is defined as Environmental Protection Agency |
| 5 | SECTION 3. | The EPA will oversee corporations' plans to eliminate PFAS, and work |
| 6 | | accordingly to help the process. |
| 7 | | A. Any corporation which does not pass a yearly examination for PFAS |
| 8 | | production decrease by the EPA will be hit with a fine of 10% of |
| 9 | | revenue made from products produced with PFAS in the previous fiscal |
| 10 | | year. |
| 11 | | B. Any corporation which does not eliminate their production of PFAS by |
| 12 | | January 1, 2025, will continue to be annually hit with a fine of 10% each |
| 13 | | year, increasing by 5% from the previous year. |
| 14 | | C. Any employee who is laid off from a job in which the company |
| 15 | | produces PFAS will be entitled to severance based on their earnings |
| 16 | | from the previous year by their employer for one year after the lay-off. |
| 17 | | This severance will end once the employee finds a new job or when the |
| 18 | | 1-year period concludes. |
| 19 | | D. Bill #251 does not apply to necessary medical equipment and |
| | | protective clothing. |
| | SECTION 4. | This legislation will take effect immediately after passage. All laws in |

conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
