2	SECTION	L. An additional tax of 0.02% shall be implemented on the
3	purchase	of fossil fuels in order to fund and encourage the use of
4	biodegra	able plastics. The increased tax on fossil fields would result in
5	the decr	ased use of fossil fuels and the increasing use of renewable
6	energy s	urces. The tax on fossil fuels will help raise the revenue being
7	lost from	the decreasing taxes on essential components of biodegradable
8	plastics.	
9	SECTION	2. Fossil fuels are defined as natural gasses, coal, and oil. The
10	encoura	ement of the use of biodegradable plastics will be done through
11	lowering	he tax on its essential components making it a viable cost-
12	friendly	ternative to the current plastics. Renewable energy sources are
13	defined	s energy collected from natural resources that can be
14	replenisl	ed and don't contribute to global warming, such as sunlight,
15	wind, wa	er movement, and geothermal energy.

SECTION 4. This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2027.

A Bill to Establish a 4-Day Workweek

1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:	
2	SECTION 1.	All federal employers that currently utilize a traditional 5-day workweek in any capacity
3		shall adopt a 4-day workweek in those same contexts, shifting Friday to a non-working
4		"weekend" day where possible. Employers shall maintain an 8-hour maximum for each
5		workday, with no reduction in salaries.
6	SECTION 2.	Federal employees who volunteer to work additional shifts beyond four days will be paid
7		overtime (minimum pay rate of time and a half).
8	SECTION 3.	State, territorial, and local governments are encouraged to adopt similar policies, as are
9		private businesses.
10	SECTION 4.	This legislation shall be overseen by the Department of Labor.
11	SECTION 5.	This legislation shall take effect on January 1, 2025.
12	SECTION 6.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.



A Bill to Limit Employment Drug Testing

1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:	
2	SECTION 1.	No employer may enact a system of random drug testing or require drug testing
3		preemptively as a condition of hiring or of continued employment.
4	SECTION 2.	Any employer found to be in violation of this legislation shall be fined no less than \$20,000
5		for each infraction, and any employee who is denied or relieved of employment on the
6		basis of drug testing that violates this legislation shall be given the choice of immediate him
7		or reinstatement or of receiving six months' wage.
8	SECTION 3.	This legislation shall be overseen by the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission.
9	SECTION 4.	This legislation shall take effect on January 1, 2024.
0	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
