Each school may enter up to three (3) teams. If there is additional space, we will be happy to accommodate requests for additional teams.

Team Fee: \$125 Judge Fee: \$200 per uncovered team*

> * Each team requires 4 rounds of qualified judging; a single judge may cover two teams. All tournament judges are expected to have philosophies posted online and any conflicts entered on the Tabroom.com site. The tournament will be providing some supplemental judging, but we strongly prefer that you avoid hiring judges through us, if at all possible. If you need to hire a judge,

please write me at GDStournament@gmail.com to be put in contact with a judge in the area who wishes to be hired. If this is not possible, for whatever reason, reach out to me and we can work something out.

Fees will be set on 21 September. Any drops after that date will forfeit the entry fee for that/those entry/entries, and an additional \$25 per dropped team.

Please note that the entry fee will also cover breakfast on Saturday, dinner on Friday, and dinner on Saturday.

We will offer one division of Varsity policy debate, featuring 7 prelims and Octafinals on the 2014-15 NFL policy debate resolution. Two prelims will be preset and the remaining 5 will be paired based on SOP (strength of opponent). The format will be 8-3-5 with ten minutes of preparation time. We will not break brackets in the elims.

Points will be on a scale of 30 with tenth of a point increments.

There will be one and only one winning team and one and only one losing team in each debate.

Despite my better judgment, we will employ "mutual preference" judging (MPJ) for judge assignment.

We will provide awards for all teams advancing to the elimination debates and for the top 15 speakers.

We are unable to accept independent entries. An independent entry is a team or student who wishes to compete without the approval, knowledge or consent of their school administration. All students must compete under the school's name in which they are officially enrolled.

This tournament functions as a Quarterfinals TOC bid in policy debate and a points qualifier for the NDCA National Championship tournament.

Chaperonage: Our expectation is that each school have at least one adult (non-high school student) present for oversight and as a contact in case of emergency. Please include this information in your Tabroom.com entry.

Tournament Hotel and Tournament Housing

HOTEL: The tournament hotel is the Doubletree Bethesda, which some of you may remember from previous GDS tournaments in years past. This beautiful facility is located at 8120 Wisconsin Ave (Bethesda, MD 20814), and their main number is (301) 652-2000. There is a block of rooms allocated to the tournament, with a rate of \$99 per night, for Thursday, Friday, and Saturday nights. In addition to top-notch accommodations, the Doubletree Bethesda is conveniently located 5 blocks from the Bethesda Metro Station, on the Red Line, two short stops away from the high school. HOUSING: In addition to the regularly-scheduled tournament hotel, we are delighted to announce that we will also be returning to the golden age of the GDS Tournament by bringing back a robust housing program for those competitors coming in from outside the Washington metro area. Housing will be offered for Friday and Saturday nights, with some limited availability on Thursday or Sunday night. Transportation

Between the location of the tournament hotel and the option of tournament housing, we strongly suggest that you avoid renting a vehicle. If you are staying at the tournament hotel, you will be able to take the Metro to and from the tournament (the hotel is 5 blocks (10 minutes +/-) from the Bethesda Metro Station and GDS is 2-3 blocks (5-7 minutes) from the Tenleytown Metro Station). If you are being housed by the tournament, transportation between the school and the homestay locations will be managed on this end as well. All of the airports and major transportation systems in the region are connected to the Metro system in one way or another:

DCA (Ronald Reagan Washington National Airport) has its own Metro station.

Dulles (Dulles International Airport): From Dulles, one can reach the Metro rail system via the Metrobus (to the Rosslyn Station) or Washington Flyer Bus (to the new Silver Line).

BWI (Baltimore/Washington International Thurgood Marshall Airport) is farther away, but often cheaper. From BWI, one can take the MARC commuter train to Union Station and access the Red Line directly.

Amtrak will take you to Union Station, which is also a transit point for the Red Line.
