A Bill to Extend the Maternity Leave

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1.	The Family and Medical Leave Act shall be amended to extend maternity
	leave to 36 weeks of paid labor
SECTION 2.	Maternity leave is defined as the period of absence from work granted to
	parents after the birth of her child.
	Paid labor is defined as at least 90% of the parent's regular pay
SECTION 3.	The Department of Labor will oversee this legislation.
	A. Penalties for noncompliance of this bill will include \$250 or a 5%
	penalty based on total revenues.
SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect on January 1 2025. All laws in conflict with
	this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Set Fair Labor Standards for Tipped Wages

2	SECTION 1.	The United States will amend Title 29 of the US Labor Code to require
3		that companies with tipped employees are paid minimum wages.
4	SECTION 2.	Once passed companies have 6 months to adhere before penalties will be
5		enforced.
6	SECTION 3.	Penalties may include but are not limited to:
7		A. A fine of 15% of the company's average annual income
8		B. Ineligibility for any tax credits
9	SECTION 4.	The United States Department of Labor as well as the Internal Revenue
10		Service will be responsible with overseeing and enforcing this legislation.
11	SECTION 5.	This legislation will take effect on January 1st 2024. All laws in conflict
12		with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Kickstart the Amelioration of Trustees (K.A.T. ACT)

1. SECTION 1.	Sentences	given to eligible inmates will now include the option to			
2.	choose between serving the duration of their sentence in a standard prison				
3.	or serving up to 15 years of their sentence in a private rehabilitation				
4.	facility. Th	facility. The time an inmate may spend in a rehabilitation facility may be			
5.	extended f	or good behavior depending on the ruling of the applicable			
6.	jurisdiction	1.			
7. SECTION 2.	A.	"Rehabilitation facilities" shall be defined as private institutions			
8.		including both psychiatric hospitals, drug/alcohol			
9.		rehabilitation complexes, or designated education facilities.			
10.	В.	i. "Eligible inmates" shall be defined as any offenders convicted			
11.		on nonviolent charges. Until more private contracts are			
12.		signed/more private facilities are constructed, priority			
13.		selection shall be provided to those convicted on 'three			
14.		strikes laws'.			
15.		ii. Those already convicted on charges that would make them			
16.		eligible for rehabilitation relocation may be retried/charged			
17.		after 5 years of their sentence have been served.

A Bill to Lower Prescription Drug Costs

1	BE IT ENACTE	D BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2	SECTION 1.	The United States will enact a markup cap for all prescription drugs.
3		A. The United States will cap markup prices by companies at 7% for
4		prescription drugs.
5		B. Companies that refuse to follow the legislation will have a federal tax
6		on profits double than the percentage of markup costs.
7	SECTION 2.	The following definitions apply:
8		A. Prescription drugs will be defined as any drug that is obtained with a
9		prescription.
10		B. Markup caps will be defined as a method to prevent companies from
11		marking up manufactured products to gain more profit.
12	SECTION 3.	The Food and Drug Adminiistration along with the Internal Revenue
13		Service will be responsible for the implementation of this bill.
14	SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect at the start of FY 2026
