A BILL TO BAN ARBITRATION CLAUSES IN EMPLOYMENT CONTRACTS

1	BE IT ENACT	TED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2	SECTION 1.	(A) The United States Federal Government will ban employers and
3		companies from using arbitration clauses in employment contracts. Legal
4		disputes between employees and their employers will be settled in court
5		and not through an arbitrator.
6		(B) All arbitration clauses in current employment contracts are hereby
7		declared unenforceable.
8	SECTION 2.	Arbitrary clauses are defined as alternative dispute resolutions where both
9		parties agree to settle disputes out-of-court with an arbitrator. Employment
10		contracts are defined as a signed agreement between an individual
11		employee and an employer or a labor union; it establishes both the rights
12		and responsibilities of the two parties: the worker and the company.
13	SECTION 3.	The Department of Labor shall be tasked with enforcement of the this
14		legislation.
15	SECTION 4.	This bill will go into effect one year from the date of passage.
16	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A BILL TO TRANSFER SEIZED RUSSIAN ASSETS TO UKRAINE

1	BE IT ENACT	TED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2	SECTION 1.	The United States will sell seized Russian assets located on U.S. soil and
3		transfer the funds to Ukraine.
4	SECTION 2.	(A) "Assets" shall be defined as the financial investments, property, cars,
5		planes, yachts, and all other items of monetary value.
6		(B) Seized assets eligible to be sold by the United States government are
7		defined as the assets that once belonged to Russian oligarchs and
8		billionaires, but were frozen by the United States government upon
9		Russia's invasion of Ukraine.
10		(C) All proceeds from the sale of seized Russian assets shall be directed
11		toward the rebuilding of Ukraine.
12	SECTION 3.	The Department of the Treasury shall be tasked with enforcement of this
13		legislation.
14	SECTION 4.	This bill will go into effect immediately upon passage.
15	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A BILL TO REGULATE INTERSTATE BUSSING OF UNDOCUMENTED MIGRANTS

1	BE IT ENACT	TED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2	SECTION 1 .	No state, without the consent of the destination state, may provide for,
3		subsidize, facilitate, or operate the transportation of undocumented
4		migrants out of the state to another state in this union for the purpose of
5		expelling such migrants from the jurisdiction thereof.
6	SECTION 2.	(A) "Undocumented migrant" shall be defined as individuals who have
7		either entered the United States in violation of the law without inspection,
8		or legally entered the United States with valid nonimmigrant visas that
9		have since expired.
10		(B) "Destination state" shall be defined as the state that the state in which
11		the undocumented migrant resides provides, subsidizes, facilitates, or
12		operates the transportation to.
13	SECTION 3.	The Department of Homeland Security shall be responsible for the
14		enforcement of this legislation
15	SECTION 4.	This bill will go into effect 30 days from the date of passage.
16	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void

A BILL TO BAN DIRECT TO CONSUMER MEDICAL ADVERTISING

1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2	SECTION 1 . All Direct-to-Consumer Advertising (DTCA) for prescription medications
3	will hereby be prohibited on all licensed television and radio channels
4	operating in the United States.
5	SECTION 2. "Direct-to-Consumer Advertising" in this bill is defined as a paid
6	promotion for any medication which is legally available only to those with
7	a doctor's prescription.
8	SECTION 2. The U.S. Food and Drug Association (FDA) and the Federal Trade
9	Commission will oversee enforcement of this legislation, and may set
10	SECTION 3. This bill will go into effect six months from the date of passage.
11	SECTION 4. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
