 - Possible rule change to exempt Speech Arts students from Rule 8-5 Awards

 - No practicing with other schools if you are not in an official co-op
- Everyone has to take 3 required courses
 - St Luke's Concussion Course
 - o NFHS Sudden Cardiac Arrest Course
 - NFHS Student Mental Health and Suicide Prevention Course
- Make sure AD has updated the IHSAA directory this is how Julie sends out communication
- New Grievance Guidelines
 - In break rounds, the only people that can file grievances are the judges from the round. Coaches will no longer be able to file grievances in out rounds (coaches will still be able to file grievances in prelims)

- Questions need to be saved to the end and will be moderated. We will try
 to answer questions directly but there might be questions that are further
 along in the process than we will be able to answer.
- Why Now?

- Statewide graduation requirements have not been reviewed or updated comprehensively in over 10 years
- Industry and workforce needs have changed dramatically over the last 10-15 years (and parents)
- The post secondary pendulum has shifted to focus on postsecondary preparation for <u>ALL</u> students (college readiness, trade school, military, religious mission, exploration, etc)

Who Benefits?

- Students creating an individualized and meaningful secondary experience for ALL students
- Districts and public charter schools retaining and increasing flexibility for schools
- Stakeholders creating a solid foundation of support from OSBE,
 SDE, and other education partners.

sUMMARY OF RECOMMENDATIONS

- Flexibility for meeting standards
- Replace 1 credit of communication with 1 credit of digital literacy
- Localized pathways minimum two pathways for future goals
- Future Readiness Project instead of Senior Project -tying back to college and career readiness
- Why are we adding digital literacy?
 - The world of work is changing
 - Maintaining flexibility for school districts
 - Student safety and mental health
 - Replacing a core state requirement flexibility is a main point of focus which is why we are replacing, not adding on

What happens to comm?

- Districts can still require it as part of the 17 elective credits
- We do not feel communications is going away it will be offered in a different way
- The expectations is that they will retain the requirement
- Localized pathways will be encouraged to require communications requirements
- "We do not feel there is an elimination but rather a shift"
- College and Career Competencies are heavy in communication concepts

• Why Speech?

- There isn't a lot of wiggle room with other content as they already are low requirements (6 math and 6 science instead of 8)
- What resources will be provided for digital literacy?
 - We don't have a full answer yet but will probably be online

- Feedback would be helpful do you prefer physical copies or digital?
- Who will make the curriculum?
 - Curriculum is decided at the local level but the department would provide the standards
- Digital literacy at the middle school why adding in high school?
 - These will be different. Build on the same concepts. Coding isn't taught at middle school so we will add on to what is being taught earlier.
 - Life after high school
- Who can teach it?
 - Anyone with a certificate because it is introductory
- Was there pressure for this course?
 - Absolutely
 - The feasibility of a straight up computer science is difficult
