1	A Bill to Invest into Water Conservation
2	BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
3	<b>SECTION 1.</b> Congress shall allocate \$750 million towards the construction of
4	technologies for farms that will help them conserve water. This will be in the form of
5	grants that farm owners can apply for.
6	<b>SECTION 2. A.</b> The technologies mentioned in Section 1 will be defined to primarily be
7	drip irrigation, micro-irrigation, and nanobubble technology.
8	<b>B.</b> "Large corporations" as mentioned in Section 3 will be defined as "a
9	corporation that had, or whose predecessor had, taxable income of \$1 million or more for
10	any of the 3 tax years immediately preceding the 2023 tax year."
11	<b>SECTION 3.</b> The money for this legislation will be provided through a 1% annual
12	increase on income taxes of large corporations.
13	SECTION 4. The Department of Agriculture shall conduct an annual analysis of the
14	amount of water used by farms. If a farm is found to use more than 1.5 acre feet of water
15	per acre, it will be fined \$50,000.
16	<b>SECTION 5.</b> The U.S Environmental Protection Agency and the Department of
17	Agriculture will work in conjunction to oversee this legislation.
18	<b>SECTION 6.</b> This legislation will come into effect the next fiscal year after passage.
19	<b>SECTION 7.</b> All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

1	A Bill to Abandon the Great American Worm Wall
2	BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
3	SECTION 1. The United States shall cease all involvement in and support for the
4	airdropping of sterile screwworm flies (Cochliomyia hominivorax) over the
5	Panama-Colombia border, or anywhere else outside of the sovereign territory of the
6	United States.
7	<b>SECTION 2.</b> Funds recovered through this change of policy shall be redirected to the
8	Department of Agriculture to support the prevention and treatment of screwworm
9	infestations within the sovereign territory of the United States.
10	<b>SECTION 3.</b> This legislation shall be overseen by the Department of Agriculture.
11	<b>SECTION 4.</b> This legislation shall take effect on January 1, 2025.
12	<b>SECTION 5</b> . All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

#### 1 A Bill to Exempt Tips from Taxation

- 2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
- 3 **SECTION 1.** Income earned as tips is no longer taxable, though it must still be reported
- 4 to the Internal Revenue Service (IRS).
- 5 **SECTION 2**. Tips are defined by the IRS as "discretionary (optional or extra) payments,
- 6 determined by a customer, that employees receive from customers."
- 7 **SECTION 3.** This legislation shall be overseen by the IRS.
- 8 **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall take effect on January 1, 2025.
- 9 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

2	BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
3	<b>SECTION 1.</b> All schools and universities throughout the United States are ordered to
4	enact firewalls blocking student access to websites and applications that enable users to
5	leverage artificial intelligence (AI) in any way that could potentially facilitate academic
6	dishonesty.
7	<b>SECTION 2.</b> Any school or university found to be in violation of this legislation shall
8	lose access to federal funding until such time as compliance is reached.
9	<b>SECTION 3.</b> This legislation shall be overseen by the Department of Education and the
10	Federal Communications Commission (FCC). In addition to monitoring and enforcing
11	implementation, these agencies shall be responsible for producing a list of websites and
12	applications that must be banned, publishing and proliferating that list at least 30 days
13	prior to the date of implementation, and maintaining that list regularly and transparently
14	<b>SECTION 4.</b> This legislation shall take effect on July 1, 2025.
15	SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void

1	A Bill to Legalize Election Betting
2	BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
3	<b>SECTION 1</b> . The placing of bets on the outcomes of elections shall no longer be banned
4	within the United States.
5	SECTION 2. Like all forms of gambling, election betting must be conducted by an
6	authorized, certified, and regulated agency.
7	<b>SECTION 3.</b> Revenue earned from election betting shall be taxed at a rate of 20%, with
8	funds raised through this tax to be turned over to the Federal Election Commission
9	(FEC).
10	<b>SECTION 4.</b> This legislation shall be overseen by the Commodity Futures Trading
11	Commission.
12	<b>SECTION 5.</b> This legislation shall take effect immediately upon passage.
13	<b>SECTION 6.</b> All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

- 2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
- 3 **SECTION 1.** The Laboratory Animal Welfare Act of 1966, Pub. L. 89–544, is hereby
- 4 amended to eliminate the law's exclusion of cold-blooded animals from its protections.
- 5 **SECTION 2.** Birds, rats of the genus Rattus, mice of the genus Mus, and farm animals
- 6 shall remain excluded.
- 7 **SECTION 3.** This legislation shall be jointly overseen by the Department of Agriculture
- 8 and the Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS).
- 9 **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall take effect on January 1, 2025.
- 10 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
