### **Prelim 1 - A Bill to Protect Payment Choice**

1	BE IT ENACTE	ED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2	SECTION 1.	All retailers offering goods and services within the United States of
3		America must:
4		A. Allow payment in cryptocurrency
5		B. Allow virtual payments via NFC
6		C. Not charge higher prices for payments other than cash.
7	SECTION 2.	This shall not apply to goods and services sold primarily through the
8		telephone or over the internet.
9	SECTION 3.	The Attorney General shall have the jurisdiction to bring action in United
LO		States District Court against any retailer found in violation.
l1		A. A first offense shall incur damages and a \$2,500 fine.
12		B. Subsequent offenses shall incur a \$5,000 fine.
L3	SECTION 4.	This shall take effect on October 1, 2025.

**SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

#### Prelim 2 - A Bill to Criminalize Electoral Reluctance

- 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2 **SECTION 1**. A county official in a position to oversee the certification of elections,
- which is normally considered a ministerial duty, who obstructs, disrupts,
- 4 or otherwise fails to vote to certify an election for a federal office shall be
- 5 considered to have committed a felony, to be adjudicated in federal
- 6 court.
- 7 **SECTION 2**. Upon conviction, the sentence of not less than 10 years imprisonment
- 8 shall be issued.
- 9 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Justice will oversee enforcement of this legislation.
- 10 **SECTION 4.** This shall take effect on November 4, 2024.
- 11 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## **Prelim 3 - A Bill to Expand the Child Tax Credit**

1	BE IT ENACTED	BY THE CONGRESS	HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
Τ.	DE II ENACIED	DI THE CUIVANESS	HENE ASSEMBLED THAT.

2	SECTION 1.	Eligible taxpayers will receive a tax credit of \$3,600 for any child under
3		age 6 claimed on their federal income tax return. A credit of \$3,000 will
4		be given for any child between ages 6-17 claimed on their federal income
5		tax return.
6	SECTION 2.	One half of the enhanced credits will be provided in monthly payments
7		beginning at the start of Fiscal Year 2025 with the other half given upon
8		the filing of the 2025 tax return.
9	SECTION 3	To be eligible, a family or single taxpayer must have filed a tax return in
10		the previous year.
11	SECTION 4.	The Internal Revenue Service will oversee the adjustment of the tax
12		credits and provide the payments as scheduled.
13	SECTION 5	Costs for this tax credit will be offset by an increase in the corporate
14		income tax rate to 35%.
15	SECTION 6.	This will take effect in FY 2025.
16	SECTION 7.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

#### **Prelim 4 - A Bill to Adjust Air Travel Regulations**

- 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2 **SECTION 1**. The Department of Transportation rule announced on April 24, 2024,
- taking effect June 25, 2024 (DOT-OST-2022-0089), is rescinded.
- 4 **SECTION 2**. Airlines are responsible for defining their own compensation for canceled
- flights. Prior to a consumer completing a purchase, they must be notified
- of and agree to the airline's policies and procedures.
- 7 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Transportation will have oversight of this legislation.
- 8 Any airline which does not properly inform consumers will be subject to
- 9 the requirements of the prior rule.
- 10 **SECTION 4.** This will take effect on January 1, 2025.
- 11 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

# Prelim 5 - A Resolution to Support the Venezuelan Opposition

1	WHEREAS,	it is abundantly clear that the opposition leader, Edmundo Gonzalez is
2		the rightful winner of the Venezuelan presidential election; and
3	WHEREAS,	current president Nicolas Maduro has refused to release any evidence to
4		the contrary; and
5	WHEREAS,	Russia and China have both congratulated Maduro on his claimed victory;
6		and
7	WHEREAS,	protests have led to at least 23 deaths and 2400 arrests; and
8	WHEREAS,	government paramilitaries are marking the doors of protesters with black
9		painted "X's"; and
10	WHEREAS,	neighboring countries have backed off initial demands that Maduro
11		immediately recognize the opposition victory; and
12	WHEREAS,	Brazilian President Lula da Silva has emerged as the leading voice in the
13		region questioning the legitimacy of the election; and
14	WHEREAS,	international pressure may be the only force which will change President
15		Maduro's opinion; now, therefore, be it
16	RESOLVED,	By the Congress here assembled that the United States supports a new
17		election in Venezuela overseen by international observers to insure free
18		and fair results.

### **Prelim 6 - A Bill to Assist the Farm Industry**

1	BE IT ENACTE	ED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2	SECTION 1.	An additional \$40 billion will be added to the farm bill funding specified in
3		H.R. 6363. If a new Farm Bill is approved prior to the implementation
4		date, separate from a continuing resolution, this funding will be added to
5		the amount appropriated in that legislation.
6	SECTION 2.	The funding is appropriated to the following categories:
7		A. \$1.9 billion to supplement disaster assistance.
8		B. \$21 billion to supplement crop proceeds.
9		C. \$4.6 billion to supplement animal product proceeds.
10		<b>D.</b> \$16.7 billion to offset production expenses.
11	SECTION 3.	The Department of Agriculture will oversee the distribution of the
12		increased funding.
13		A. A tariff of 10% on all agricultural imports will be implemented to
14		provide funding for this legislation.
15	SECTION 4.	This will take effect on October 1, 2024.

**SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

#### **Prelim 7 - A Bill to Provide Ethics to the Entire Judiciary**

- 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2 **SECTION 1**. The Code of Conduct for United States Judges as adopted by the Judicial
- 3 Conference of the United States, shall apply in whole to the justices of
- 4 the Supreme Court.
- 5 **SECTION 2**. The Judicial Conference will create guidelines compelling resignation of
- 6 any judge or justice who does not adhere to the Code of Conduct, as
- 7 determined by either the Judicial Conference or a Congressional
- 8 committee.
- 9 **SECTION 3.** To ensure compliance with the Code of Conduct, the Internal Revenue
- 10 Service will conduct an annual financial audit of the justices of the
- 11 Supreme Court
- 12 **SECTION 4.** This will take effect on the first day of the Supreme Court term following
- passage.
- 14 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

#### **Prelim 8 - A Bill to Clarify Mining Regulations**

- 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2 **SECTION 1**. A claimant shall have the right to use and occupy to conduct operations
- on public land, with or without the discovery of a valuable mineral
- 4 deposit provided the claimant makes a timely payment of both the
- 5 location fee and claim maintenance fees required in current law.
- 6 **SECTION 2**. The claimant is defined as the person or corporation responsible for the
- 7 development of the public land as outlined in section 1. Operations shall
- 8 be considered any activity or work carried out in connection with
- 9 prospecting, exploration, discovery, development, extraction, or
- 10 processing of a locatable mineral.
- 11 **SECTION 3.** The Bureau of Land Management and the United States Forest Service
- 12 will oversee this legislation.
- 13 **SECTION 4.** This shall take effect on January 1, 2025.
- 14 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

### Semi A - A Resolution to Protect American Data

1	WHEREAS,	National Public Data confirmed a massive data breach; and
2	WHEREAS,	the Social Security number of almost every American has been
3		compromised; and
4	WHEREAS,	the combination of these numbers along with names, addresses, phone
5		numbers, and other personal information leaves Americans vulnerable to
6		identity theft; and
7	WHEREAS,	National Public Data did not report this breach until news of a lawsuit
8		became public; and
9	WHEREAS,	current technology is insufficient to protect confidential data; and
10	WHEREAS,	solutions to keep this data private exist within the world of
11		cryptocurrency; and
12	WHEREAS,	blockchain technology has the potential to be converted to private use;
13		now, therefore, be it
14	RESOLVED,	By the Congress here assembled that the Social Security Administration
15		explore new blockchain-based technologies to protect confidential data;
16		and be it
17	FURTHER RES	<b>SOLVED,</b> that the SSA work to convert all confidential data to this
18		blockchain system within the next twenty years.

#### **Semi B - A Bill to Invoke the Leahy Law on Current Conflicts**

- 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2 **SECTION 1**. The Bureau of Democracy, Human Rights and Labor, and the relevant
- 3 United States embassies will undertake an analysis of the current
- 4 conflicts between Ukraine and Russia, and Israel and Hamas with respect
- 5 to any violations of human rights.
- 6 **SECTION 2**. Post analysis, the Leahy Law will be applied. Any entity found to violate
- 7 human rights with impunity will have assistance withheld until the host
- 8 nation government takes effective steps to cease such violations.
- 9 **SECTION 3.** The Department of State will oversee the analysis and enforcement of
- the Leahy Law.
- 11 **SECTION 4.** This will take effect upon passage.
- 12 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

### **Semi C - A Bill to End Forced Arbitration**

1	BE II ENACIE	D BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2	SECTION 1.	No contract or agreement shall be written or agreed to between two
3		parties which has the effect of denying a party access to the court system
4		for relief in the event of negligence or breach of contract.
5	SECTION 2.	Such contracts and agreements may be, but are not limited to,
6		employment agreements or contracts for goods and services.
7	SECTION 3.	Enforcement will be handled by the following departments:
8		A. Employment contracts and agreements will be overseen by the
9		Department of Labor.
10		B. Agreements involving the exchange of physical goods or online
11		services will be overseen by the Federal Trade Commission.
12		C. Agreements involving financial products will be overseen by the
13		Consumer Financial Protection Bureau.
14		<b>D.</b> Violations of this legislation which are deemed to deny consumers the
15		right to relief in a court of law shall result in treble damages.
16	SECTION 4.	This shall take effect immediately upon passage.
17	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

#### Final A - A Bill to Discourage Universal Voucher Programs

- 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2 **SECTION 1**. Any state which implements a universal voucher program will be
- 3 ineligible for all federal education grants.
- 4 **SECTION 2**. A universal voucher program diverts public money which would
- 5 otherwise be directed to public school systems to private, religious, or
- 6 home schools, regardless of student attendance in the public school
- 7 system.
- 8 **SECTION 3.** The Secretary of Education will determine the eligibility of states for
- 9 federal education grants. States which are declared ineligible for grants
- due to implementing a universal voucher program may regain eligibility
- upon the reversal of said voucher program, but not until September 1 of
- the following year.
- 13 **SECTION 4.** This shall take effect on September 1, 2025.
- 14 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

# Final B - A Resolution to Support the Defense Treaty Between Japan and the Philippines

1	WHEREAS,	Japan and the Philippines have signed a mutual defense treaty; and
2	WHEREAS,	this treaty is designed to counter Chinese aggression in the region; and
3	WHEREAS,	China has claimed territorial rights in areas previously deemed to be
4		neutral waters or under the control of Japan or the Philippines; and
5	WHEREAS,	the Chinese coast guard has confronted Philippine ships in the South
6		China Sea several times this year; and
7	WHEREAS,	the worst of these confrontations resulted in several injuries to Filipino
8		sailors; and
9	WHEREAS,	Japan has likewise expressed concern over Chinese movements in the
10		East China Sea; and
11	WHEREAS,	unanswered signs of aggression could result in a newly emboldened
12		China; and
13	WHEREAS,	Chinese aggression in the region is detrimental to United States interests
14		in East Asia; now, therefore, be it
15	RESOLVED,	By the Congress here assembled that the United States should support
16		the treaty between Japan and the Philippines and provide assistance
17		when requested.

### Final C - A Bill to Eliminate Taxation on Tipped Income

1	BE IT ENACTE	ED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2	SECTION 1.	Income from tips or gratuities will be exempt from taxation, including
3		Social Security and Medicare taxes. All income derived from tips or
4		gratuities must be reported on IRS form 4070A to differentiate it from
5		wages earned from an employer.
6	SECTION 2.	Income from tips or gratuities will include, but is not limited to:
7		A. Cash tips received directly from customers
8		<b>B.</b> Tips from customers who leave a tip through electronic settlement
9		or payment. This includes a credit card, debit card, gift card or any
10		other electronic payment method.
11		<b>C.</b> The value of any noncash tips, such as tickets or other items of
12		value.
13		<b>D.</b> Tip amounts received from other employees paid out through tip
14		pools, tip splitting, or other formal/informal tip sharing
15		arrangements.
16	SECTION 3.	The Internal Revenue Service will adjust form 1040 and 1040A to reflect
17		the tax exemptions when calculating income tax owed.
18		A. No fewer than ten percent of all returns which contain income from
19		tips or gratuities shall be subject to audit during a fiscal year.
20		<b>B.</b> If the result of the audit shows income fraudulently categorized as tip
21		or gratuity, a penalty of no less than double the amount falsely
22		claimed shall be assessed.
23	SECTION 4.	This will take effect on October 1, 2025.
24	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
