# A Bill to Enable Student Debt to Be Unconditionally Discharged Through Bankruptcy

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED: 1 2 **SECTION 1.** No longer shall a debtor be required to show "undue hardship" (section 3 523(a)(8) of the Bankruptcy Code) in order to discharge student debt via 4 bankruptcy. Student debt shall henceforth be indistinguishable from 5 other forms of debt as far as bankruptcy law is concerned. 6 **SECTION 2.** This legislation shall be overseen by the United States Trustee Program, a 7 component of the Department of Justice. 8 This legislation shall take effect on January 1, 2025. **SECTION 3.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void. 9 **SECTION 4.**

### A Resolution to Amend the Constitution to Establish Federal Ballot Measures

1	RESOLVED,	That t	he following article is proposed as an amendment to the
2		Consti	itution of the United States, which shall be valid to all intents and
3		purpo	ses as part of the Constitution when ratified by the legislatures of
4		three-	fourths of the several states within seven years from the date of its
5		submi	ssion by the Congress:
6		ARTICLE —	
7		SECTION 1.	Congress shall make no law abridging the right of the people to
8			call for and vote on ballot measures, namely initiatives and
9			referendums, at the federal level.
10		SECTION 2.	In order to be placed on the ballot, initiated federal statutes shall
11			require a number of signatures from registered voters equal to
12			10% of the number of votes cast in the most recent general
13			election, while initiated constitutional amendments shall require a
14			number of signatures from registered voters equal to 15% of the
15			number of votes cast in the most recent general election. In all
16			cases, signatures must be submitted at least 180 days prior to the
17			day of the election in which the initiative will be voted on.
18		SECTION 3.	Up until 90 days prior to the day of an election, Congress may put
19			forth federal referendums by a simple majority vote, regardless of
20			whether that referendum would amount to a constitutional
21			amendment. Congress may put forth referendums either in
22			conjunction with initiatives or independently.
23		SECTION 4.	It shall be the responsibility of the Vice President to oversee ballot
24			measures once submitted and to approve or deny them for
25			inclusion on the ballot. This decision must be based solely on
26			procedure and constitutionality, and must be made free of
27			political bias. The Supreme Court shall have the power to overturn
28			the Vice President's decision if a majority deems it to be politically
29			motivated.
30		SECTION 5.	To gain the force of law, a ballot measure that seeks to enact a
31			federal statute shall require a simple majority of the popular vote,
32			while a ballot measure that seeks to amend the Constitution shall
33			require a two-thirds majority of the popular vote.
34		SECTION 6.	The Congress shall have power to enforce this article by
35			appropriate legislation.

## A Resolution to Promote Lawn Liberty

1	WHEREAS	Many ordinances regarding lawn maintenance are rooted in a very
2		narrow and aesthetic vision; and
3	WHEREAS	To infringe upon the choice of how to tend (or if to tend) one's lawn is, at
4		its core, a fairly basic violation of this nation's core value of liberty; and
5	WHEREAS	Lawn maintenance as required by many states and municipalities leads to
6		wasteful water usage and destroys potential habitats for pollinators; now,
7		therefore be it
8	RESOLVED	by the Congress here assembled that states, districts, territories, and
9		municipalities are strongly discouraged from making any law
10		circumscribing how homeowners may maintain their lawns; and be it
11	<b>FURTHER RESOLVED</b>	that Congress encourages homeowners to cultivate their lawns in ways
12		that conserve water, promote habitats for pollinators, and otherwise
13		support environmental sustainability.
