

A Bill to Abolish Cellphone-Free Education (V)

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** Cellphones will be allowed during transitions, study halls,
3 and lunch.

4 **SECTION 2.** Study Hall is defined as a free period during the school
5 day.

6 **SECTION 3.** All school administration and staff will be responsible for
7 overseeing the implementation of this bill.

8 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2025. All
9 laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null
10 and void.

A Bill to Make Air Travel Less Restrictive (D)

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** A REAL ID should not be required for domestic air travel.

3 **SECTION 2.** A REAL ID is a driver's license or identification card that is
4 also a federally accepted form of identification.

5 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Homeland Security will oversee the
6 implementation of this bill.

7 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on May 1, 2025. All laws in
8 conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and
9 void.

Artificial Intelligence Audits in Medical Care (AIAMC) (E)

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** The United States Government will ensure that Hospitals, Private
3 Practices, and Medical Centers that utilize Artificial Intelligence (AI) in
4 medical practice will be required to submit bi-annual
5 performance audits.
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7 **SECTION 2.** A. Artificial Intelligence in the medical field shall be defined as the
8 simulation of human processes done by Large Language Models (LLM),
9 Generative AI, and other AI technologies applied in medical practice,
10 B. Audit shall be defined as a thorough assessment of records, efficiency,
11 and ethical implications of an operation.
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13 **SECTION 3.** This legislation shall be enforced by the joint committee of the
14 Department of Health and Human Services and the National AI Advisory
15 Committee. If usage of AI in medical practice is found to violate ethical,
16 performance, and factual standards of a joint committee of the
17 Department of Health and Human Services and the National AI Advisory
18 Committee and the 1996 HIPAA law, it will result in
19 A. The suspension of medical license for the individual.
20 B. A fine of \$10,000,000 U.S. Dollars for the institution.
21 C. Opening the institution and the individual for medical malpractice.
22 D. An establishment of an appeal process, allowing individuals and
23 institutions to contest audit findings or penalties within 60 days of the
24 audit report.
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26 **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall take effect on January 1, 2025. All laws in conflict
27 with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Cell Phone Freedom (C.P.F.) Act (V)

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** Students shall be allowed to use their personal devices in school.

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4 **SECTION 2.** The use of cell phones in schools means that students can use their
5 personal devices not owned by the school during school. For example
6 free time after lectures, lunch, time between classes and with the
7 teacher's permission. The idea of using cell phones during class and
8 school are different ideas. For assignment purposes students have
9 Chromebooks owned by the school and cell phones should be away
10 during lecture.

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12 **SECTION 3.** This bill shall be enforced by the Virginia Board of Education

A Bill to Authorize the Sale of Weapons to the Republic of Sudan (I)

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. Resources shall be authorized to be sold to the Republic of Sudan.

SECTION 2. Resources shall be defined as weaponry such as firearms, attack helicopters, ammunition, and artillery.

SECTION 3. Implementation of this bill shall be carried out by the Department of State through the Bureau of Political-Military Affairs. The department will negotiate the sale with the Republic of Sudan, maintain the safety of the resources, and oversee the transportation of the resources to Sudan.

SECTION 4. This legislation shall take effect on October 1, 2025. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

The Virginia State Government shall encourage limited use of personal electronic devices in Virginia Primary to Secondary school (V)

Section 1:

The Virginia state government shall encourage schools to implement policies limiting the use of personal electronic devices, such as smartphones and tablets, during instructional time.

Section 2:

- a. The Virginia Department of Education shall be responsible for monitoring and ensuring compliance with these policies.
- b. The Department shall also support schools in developing effective strategies to reduce student use of personal electronic devices during school hours.
- c. Additionally, the Virginia Department of Education will work with schools to assess the policies' impact and make any necessary adjustments to ensure their successful implementation.

Section 3:

Each District will be eligible for monitoring and ensuring compliance. All schools in Virginia will be under this new regulation. The Virginia Department of Education shall be responsible for enforcing the provisions of this bill.

Section 4:

This bill shall take effect at the beginning of the next school year (2025-2026). Under its provisions, all existing policies related to the use of personal electronic devices during school hours are subject to review and revision. All conflicting laws are hereby declared null and void

SECTION 5. This legislation will take place on January 30, 2025. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A RESOLUTION TO ENACT CONGRESSIONAL TERM LIMITS (D)

- WHEREAS,** Congressional representatives currently have no limit on the amount of terms they can serve; and
- WHEREAS,** Reelection rates are over 95%, ensuring that, once elected, those in power can stay that way; and
- WHEREAS,** This results in a Congress that is out of touch with the citizens they represent, filled with corruption, and avoids covering controversial issues due to it potentially harming their reelection rate; now, therefore, be it
- RESOLVED,** By two-thirds of the Congress here assembled, that the following article is proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several states within seven years from the date of its submission by the Congress:

ARTICLE --

SECTION 1: A term limit on the number of times Senators and Representatives for the House can be reelected shall be put in place. The term limit will be at a maximum of 2 terms for the Senate and 3 terms for the House.

SECTION 2: The Congress shall have power to enforce this article by appropriate legislation.

A Bill to Provide Healthcare to Rural Communities by Raising Taxes on the Wealthiest Virginians (V)

Article I: **A.** The State of Virginia shall make at least 1 Free-Standing Emergency Facility mandatory in every rural county in Virginia.

B. Insurance companies shall be obligated to pay healthcare costs regardless of whether a medical facility is ‘in-network’ or not.

C. The State of Virginia shall be responsible for the creation of and licensure of FSEDs

D. All healthcare workers who work for these newly created FSEDs will see a minimum salary of 60,000 dollars a year.

Article II: **A.** A “Freestanding Emergency Facility” is defined as "facility that is structurally separate and distinct from a hospital and provides emergency care."

B. A “rural county” is defined as a county with less than 20,000 people

Article III: The provisions of this bill shall take effect January 1st, 2025

Article IV: The Virginia Department of Health and Human Services shall be responsible for enforcing the provisions of this bill. funding for these projects shall be possible by the creation of a new net worth tax of 10% on all Virginians who make more than 10 million dollars a year.

Article V: All laws or portions of laws in conflict with this bill shall be null and void.

Bill to Establish the Artificial Intelligence Regulatory Agency (AIRA) (E)

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in
2 Congress assembled that:

3 Article I: The establishment of the Artificial Intelligence Regulatory Agency (AIRA) is authorized.

4 Article II: The term “Artificial Intelligence” in this bill shall be defined as any system or technology
5 that simulates human-like intelligence, including machine learning, deep learning, and autonomous
6 systems. AIR shall have the authority to issue regulations, conduct inspections, and impose fines for
7 violations as necessary for the effective regulation on the use of artificial intelligence technologies.

8 Article III: The AIRA shall be responsible for enforcing the provisions of this bill.

9 Article IV: The provisions of this bill shall take effect immediately upon passage.

10 Article V: Any laws and policies in conflict with this new law are hereby deemed null

A Bill to Prohibit International Commercial Air Transport in the United States (D)

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1 **SECTION 1.** The United States shall enact this bill to make any commercial air transport
2 between foreign entities and the United States of America and its
3 territories illegal.
- 4 **SECTION 2.** Commercial air transport is defined as an aircraft operation to transport
5 passengers, cargo, or mail for remuneration or other valuable
6 consideration.
- 7 **SECTION 3.** The U.S. Department of Transportation and the U.S. Department of
8 Homeland Security will oversee and enforce this bill.
- 9 A. Any commercial aircraft that attempts to travel to or from the United
10 States and its territories shall be met with consequences at a minimum
11 of a \$100,000 fine to a maximum of destruction of the aircraft by any
12 means deemed necessary.
- 13 B. The level of punishment used shall be determined by the perceived
14 threat.
- 15 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on October 27, 2024. All laws in conflict with
16 this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Regulate AI in Schools to Ensure Fair Use (E)

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **SECTION 1.** All artificial intelligence (AI) tools used in schools must follow rules that
2 protect students and promote fairness.

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4 **SECTION 2.** "Artificial Intelligence" means computer programs that can perform tasks
5 usually done by humans, like answering questions or making decisions.
6 "Schools" refers to all public and private educational institutions, including
7 elementary, middle, high schools, and colleges.

8 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Education will oversee enforcement of this law.
9 A. Schools must submit reports showing how they use AI and ensuring it is
10 safe and fair
11 B. Inspections will be conducted to check compliance with these rules.

12 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on July 1, 2025. All laws in conflict with this
13 legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Enforce Rural Healthcare in Virginia by Investing in Clinics (V)

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. Monetary support will be provided in rural areas in Virginia to help promote health. It will be used to invest in clinics, for easy access to those who need aid.

SECTION 2. Rural Healthcare means the health of people living in rural areas that have distant healthcare facilities than people in urban areas. A clinic in this context is a hospital department in which outpatients are given treatment for mental or physical struggle.

SECTION 3. The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services will implement and authorize this bill. Financial aid will shortly be dispatched after the passing of this bill.

SECTION 4. This legislation will take effect on June 1st, 2025

SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Ban the Usage of Cell Phones Inside a School Environment (V)

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. Virginia's Department of Education will implement a policy prohibiting cell phone usage, specifically during class time, within the confines of a school building. This regulation will apply to any student inside of any Virginia school district and will be enforced throughout the school year.

SECTION 2. A statewide ban on personal cell phones and other digital devices will be implemented, restricting their use in the school environment during class time. This policy will apply to all students and will be enforced by the school staff, with specific guidelines stating when and where it is appropriate to be on their device at times. Certain exceptions may be made for emergency and or educational purposes as directed by teachers.

SECTION 3. Virginia's Department of Education will authorize this bill. Schools that lie under a Virginia district will be affected once this bill takes effect.

SECTION 4. This legislation is to take effect as soon as April 1st, 2025

SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
