

Helping Appalachian Families Access Healthcare (HAFAH) (V)

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. The United States will provide funding to establish 12 mobile healthcare units to be used in the Appalachian Region.

SECTION 2. Rural areas will be defined as neighborhoods that fall outside a 60-minute drive to the nearest hospital and/or healthcare facility.

The Appalachian region of Virginia is the mountains west of the Coastal Plain and starting at the Blue Ridge.

Mobile healthcare units are tractor trailers that will come stocked with medical tools, medicine, and medical staff and provide medical services on a variety of levels.

SECTION 3. The Virginia Department of Health will be responsible for overseeing the 11 implementation of this bill.

SECTION 4. This legislation will take effect on July 1, 2025. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to stop Airline Prices from Fluctuating (D)

A Bill to Implement a Global Wealth Tax (I)

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. A global wealth tax of 2% will be imposed annually on all individuals with net assets exceeding \$50 million.

SECTION 2. Definitions: "Net assets" shall mean the total value of an individual's assets minus liabilities. "Individuals" shall include all persons regardless of nationally or residency status.

SECTION 3. The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) will oversee the enforcement of this global wealth tax in collaboration with international financial regulatory bodies.

A. The IRS will coordinate with foreign tax authorities to ensure compliance through information sharing and joint audits.

B. Penalties for non-compliance will include fines up to 10% of the unpaid tax and potential legal action.

SECTION 4. This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2025. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared invalid.

A Bill to Make Mortgage Rates More Reasonable (E)

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** Mortgage rates should be based on the Homeowner's Net

4 **SECTION 2.** Net Income is defined as an employee's earnings after all
5 deductions are taken out.

Maintaining Democracy in Sudan (M.D.S.) Act (I)

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** The United States shall not join a United Nations agreement in support of
3 either side of the Civil war in Sudan or provide military equipment to the
4 Sudanese Armed Forces (SAF) or the Rapid Support Forces (RSF). The Civil
5 War in Sudan be called to a year-long cease-fire with monthly sessions
6 held with the idea of resolving the matter in a democratic way.
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8 **SECTION 2.** Sessions shall be defined as the meeting of the fifteen highest-ranking
9 political leaders for the SAF and RSF called to meet in the middle ground
10 territory agreed upon by both the SAF and RSF and mediated by political
11 representatives with the goal of coming to a diplomatic conclusion.
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13 **SECTION 3.** This Legislation shall be enforced by the Department of State.
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15 **SECTION 4.** This bill shall be implemented immediately upon passing into law. All laws
16 in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
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Forbiddance of Global Tax (F.G.T.) Act (I)

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** The United States of America shall forbid taking part in a global wealth
3 tax where all humans are taxed based on their net capital. In the case
4 that an international organization like the United Nations (UN) wants to
5 implement this tax, The United States of America must refrain from
6 involvement.

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8 **SECTION 2.** Forbiddance shall be defined as abstaining from such a system as
9 defined in Article 1.

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11 **SECTION 3.** This Bill shall be enforced by The Department of the Treasury.

12 **SECTION 4.** This bill is to be enacted immediately upon the passing of the bill. All laws
13 in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Congress Term Limit Act (C.T.L.) (D)

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** The U.S. Congress shall have a term limit of 12 years respectively. The
3 Senate limit shall be 2 terms consecutively or nonconsecutively. The
4 House of Representatives limit shall be 6 terms consecutively or non
5 consecutively.
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7 **SECTION 2.** a. A Term Limit is defined by the amount of years a congressman can
8 serve in a position.

9 b. Consecutively shall be defined as terms served continuously,

10 c. Nonconsecutively shall be defined as terms not served continuously.
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12 **SECTION 3.** This bill shall be enforced by the U.S. Congress
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14 **SECTION 4.** This bill shall be enacted on November 5th, 2024
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A BILL TO FORBID THE BAN OF CELLPHONES IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS (V)

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. Governor Youngkins Executive Order 33 shall be repealed and instead replaced with a Bill to Forbid the Ban of Cellphones in Public Schools.

SECTION 2. Governor Youngkins Executive Order 33 bans any kind of use of cell phones in public schools K-12 from the start of the day until the end.

SECTION 3. The Virginia Department of Education shall oversee the repulsion of Executive Order 33 and implement a Bill to Forbid the Ban of Cellphones in Public Schools.

SECTION 4. This bill shall be implemented upon passage.

SECTION 5. All laws conflicting with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Restrict and Regulate Air Travel (D)

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. It is in the public interest that legislation increases regulations in the airline industry
should be enacted to facilitate access to cheaper air travel for all Americans.

SECTION 2. Therefore the regulations implemented include during the time of ticket purchase,
airlines must clearly disclose any additional fees relating to any services or accommodations,
conduct an algorithm for analyzing and determining reasonable limits and fees charged to
carriers, and establish regulations limiting the amount that airlines may charge.

SECTION 3. The Federal Aviation Administration will oversee the enforcement of changes made
to reduce air travel costs. The FAA will fund the regulations stated in the
mandates.

SECTION 4. This legislation will take effect immediately.

A Bill to Prohibit Phone Usage in Schools in Virginia (V)

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

Section 1. This bill shall show that Executive Order 33, also known as
Virginian School Phone ban, is needed

Section 2. VA Executive Order 33 was recently passed on July 9, 2024.
This order was passed to bring a cell phone-free
environment to schools across Virginia. However, this does
not concern/involve any of the other states.

Section 3. This enforcement shall be carried out by the Virginian Board of
Education, which will oversee that each school in each
county abides by the rules and regulations. Failure to comply
will result in suspension of positions or complete termination.

SECTION 4. This legislation will continue to be in effect. All laws in conflict
with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A BILL TO MAKE HOMEOWNERSHIP GREAT AGAIN (E)

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. a) A Federal Downpayment Assistance Program shall be implemented to allow first generation, first time, lower income homebuyers, including partners, to more easily purchase a home. Qualifying potential homeowners must already qualify for the home loan they are being assisted on. The down payment assistance shall cover up to 10% of the home's value. This total amount of assistance per case shall not exceed \$30,000.

b) The funding for this program shall come from a .75% federal property tax on houses with an assessed price of \$5 million or more. No more than \$2 billion in assistance shall be provided each year.

SECTION 2. a) First generation homebuyers shall be defined as those whose parents did not previously own a house. First time homebuyers shall be defined as those who have not previously owned a house. Lower income homebuyers shall be defined as those who are at or below the median area income. In the case of partners purchasing a home together, both partners must have not previously owned a home and they must meet at least one other qualification stated. Also in the case of partners, their combined income must not exceed the median area household income.

b) Assessed price is defined as the assigned value of the house calculated through comparing house sales in the area, location, house price, and any additions made to the house. The assessed price shall be the same one as used in state level property taxes.

SECTION 3. The US Department of Housing and Urban Development and the Internal Revenue Service shall oversee the enforcement of the bill.

SECTION 4. This bill will go into effect on January 1st, 2025.

SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Allocate USAID to Sudan for Food Insecurity (I)

**A BILL TO ENFORCE THE OPEN DISCLOSURE OF ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE TO
REGULATE CONTENT (E)**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. The open disclosure of Artificial Intelligence (AI) use in any form of media, including image, video, and audio content shall be required.

SECTION 2. Artificial Intelligence refers to the theory and development of computer systems able to perform tasks that normally require human intelligence. Image content refers to a representation of the external form of a person or art. Video content refers to the recording, reproducing or broadcasting of moving visual images. Audio content refers to sound, especially when recorded, transmitted, or reproduced. Disclosure refers to the act of making new or secret information known.

SECTION 3. The Federal Trade Commission shall enforce the provisions of this bill.

SECTION 4. All provisions of the bill go into effect January 1 2025.

SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Ban Artificial Intelligence Voice Cloning
