14		organisms will help reach a true conclusion regarding their safety; now,

17	<b>RESOLVED</b> , By the Congress here assembled that the amount of funding going toward	
18		research into genetically modified organisms shall hereby be increased
19		substantially; and, be it

21	FURTHER RESOLVED, that the amount and allocation of this funding shall be determined	
22		by the Department of Agriculture.

18	towa	rd graduation each to continue in the program. Funds will be available for a	
19	maxir	num of 5 years or the completion of a 4-year degree, whichever comes first.

21	SECTION 4. T	This bill will become effective in the Fall semester of 2026.
