### A Bill to Increase Funding for Power Africa

- 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2 SECTION 1. The 2023 Fiscal Year Budget for the United States Agency for International
- Development (USAID) will be increased to \$65 billion USD. \$5 billion USD of this
- 4 additional funding is earmarked to increase activity and personnel relating to
- 5 Power Africa initiatives on the African continent.
- 6 SECTION 2. Power Africa employs a transaction-centered approach to directly address the
- 7 constraints to project development and investment in sub-Saharan Africa's
- 8 energy sector.
- 9 **SECTION 3.** USAID is responsible for the distribution of the additional funds.
- 10 **SECTION 4.** This bill is effective October 27, 2025.
- 11 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## A Resolution to Limit Violence in the West Bank

1	WHEREAS,	the war between the state of Israel and Harakat al-Muqawamah	
2		al-Islamiyya (Hamas) over control of the Gaza Strip has been raging for	
3		nearly 1 year; and	
4	WHEREAS,	up till this point, no peace talk or cease-fire has been effectively discussed	
5		and solidified by both parties; and	
6	WHEREAS,	Israel's air and ground defense campaigns have resulted in the deaths of	
7		more than 40,000 and the displacement of 2.3 million civilians; and	
8	WHEREAS,	since October 7, 2023, the United States has provided the state of Israel	
9		with upwards of \$12.5 billion in military aid; now, therefore, be it	
10	RESOLVED,	That the Congress here assembled hereby terminate all financial support to	
11		the state of Israel; and, be it	
12	2 <b>FURTHER RESOLVED,</b> That this Congress not reinstate funding until the state of Israel can		
13		prove it has reached a cease-fire agreement with the organization of	
14		Hamas.

#### A Bill to Decrease Tariffs on Chinese Electric Vehicles

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- Section 1. Import taxes on electric vehicles made in China shall be set to 25%
- **Section 2.** An "electric vehicle" shall be defined as any vehicle designed to operate exclusively on electricity stored in a rechargeable battery, multiple batteries, or battery pack, and that requires a license to legally operate on public roads.
- Section 3. United States Customs and Border Protection shall enforce this legislation.
- **Section 4.** This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2025. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

# A Bill to Implement EPR Among Large Corporations Across the United States

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- **SECTION 1.** Large corporations will be required to implement EPR for the purpose of holding them financially accountable for the products they use and the waste they produce.
- **SECTION 2**. A. EPR, or extended producer responsibility, shall be defined as a policy that requires manufacturers of plastic products to retain financial responsibility for the waste management of the products they create.
  - B. A large corporation shall be defined as "a corporation, or a predecessor corporation, [that] had federal taxable income of one million dollars or more for any of the immediately preceding three taxable years".
- **SECTION 3.** The United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) shall be tasked with implementing this legislation. Any and all found in violation of this legislation will be subject to a fine of up to \$700,000,000.
  - A. If a corporation has implemented EPR and does not adhere to it, they will be subject to a fine of up to \$1 billion per infraction.
- **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect January 1, 2025.
- **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## A Bill to Make Voting Mandatory

Be it enacted by congress here assembled that:

- Section 2: A United States citizen is defined as any individual who is a citizen of the United States by law, birth, or naturalization.
- Section 3: The United States federal government will make sure that polling places are accessible to all citizens.
- Section 4: All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

8		either insufficient in scope or too underfunded to enact widespread
9		change to prevent or reduce large-scale coastal erosion, now therefore be
10		it
11	RESOLVED,	that this Congress here assembled recommend significantly increasing
12		federal funding toward coastline protection programs such as coastal
13		armoring, beach and soil stabilization, or wave energy mitigation, and be
14		it
15	FURTHER RES	<b>OLVED,</b> that this Congress recommend that the National Oceanic and
16		Atmospheric Administration increase the amount of grants available for
17		the purposes of funding local coastal protection and remediation
18		projects.
