

A Bill to Increase Voting Accessibility for Voters with Disabilities

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **SECTION 1.** This bill proposes that the U.S. Government increases accessibility for
2 voters with disabilities who struggle to make it to in-person voting.

3 **SECTION 2.** Disabilities include but are not limited to impairment in hearing, vision,
4 cognition, and mobility. For this bill, it means any issue that prevents
5 people from going to the in-person elections.

6 **SECTION 3.** The EAC (U.S Election Assistance Commission) would be responsible for
7 implementing more accessible options and safely monitoring them.

8 A. This would involve creating and executing voting methods such as, early
9 in-person voting, curbside voting, and ballot drop boxes.

10 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on November 5, 2024. All laws in conflict
11 with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Implement a Free Therapist in Public Highschools

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1 **SECTION 1.** This bill will require all secondary public education institutes in the United
2 States to provide all student with the opportunity to meet with a free
3 therapist.
- 4 **SECTION 2.** Public schools are learning institutions that are funded by local, state
5 and/or federal governments. Therapist must follow individual state
6 licensing rules.
- 7 **SECTION 3.** The SAMHSA (Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration)
8 will oversee the implementation of this bill. All secondary public education
9 institutions grades 9-12 will be required to hire a minimum of one licensed
10 therapist.
- 11 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on January 9, 2025. All laws in conflict with
12 this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

6 required to follow this implementation.

7 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on October 12, 2025. All laws in conflict with
8 this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

SECTION 1. This bill will require all imports to have a fee based on the greenhouse gasses produced during their production to reduce global pollution, support domestic businesses and industries, and restrict producers ability to manufacture in countries with more lenient environmental regulations.

SECTION 2. Greenhouse gasses are gasses that contribute to the greenhouse effect by absorbing infrared radiation, ex. carbon dioxide and chlorofluorocarbons. A domestic business is one that conducts its affairs in its home country, or in the state where it was incorporated.

SECTION 3. The EPA (Environmental Protection Agency) would be responsible for monitoring the greenhouse gas emissions. The CBP (U.S Customs and Border Protection) would be responsible for implementing and enforcing the fee.

SECTION 4. This legislation will take effect on April 22, 2026. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
