Bill #I1118

A Bill to Enhance NATO Fundings Towards Collective Defense Capabilities

SECTION 1. The United States shall increase its annual contributions to the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) by 20% to enhance joint defense capabilities, cybersecurity infrastructure, and rapid-response forces within member nations.

SECTION 2. Allow these definitions to clarify

- A. Define Annual Contributions: The financial support provided by the United States to NATO, calculated as a percentage of the U.S. Gross Domestic Product (GDP).
- B. Joint Defense Capabilities: The military reserves and strategies utilized and used by NATO to ensure a collective security.
- C. Rapid-Response Forces: Military units that are found within NATO that are able to quickly respond to any incoming threats.
- **SECTION 3.** Oversight and Enforcement: The following government agencies shall oversee the implementation of this bill:
 - A. Department of Defense (DoD): Charged with overseeing the distribution of the increased funds to ensure they are directed towards enhancing NATO's collective defense and cybersecurity efforts.
 - B. Department of Homeland Security (DHS): Responsible for coordinating cybersecurity initiatives that support NATO's defense infrastructure.
 - C. The DoD and DHS shall jointly submit an annual report to Congress, detailing the allocation and impact of the increased funding on NATO operations,
- **SECTION 4.** "All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void."
