A Bill to Forbid Convicted Felons from Being Nominated in the U.S. Presidential Election

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	SECTION 1.	Any person convicted of any felony shall hereby be forbidden from being
2		nominated as a presidential candidate and shall not be allowed to run in
3		the presidential election in the United States of America.
4	SECTION 2.	Presidential candidate is defined as an individual who has been nominated
5		for election to the office of the president of the United States.
6	SECTION 3.	The Federal Election Commission and the United States Department of
7		Justice.
8	SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect on October 25th, 2024. All laws in conflict
9		with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Ban AI in the United States of America to Protect Privacy Rights

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	SECTION 1.	All forms of AI, including ChatGPT, Google AI, etc, shall be banned from use
2		within the United States to protect the privacy rights of individuals due to
3		the damaging impact of AI generated inappropriate content of individuals
4		without their consent.
5	SECTION 2.	Privacy rights can be defined as the right of persons to be free of
6		unwarranted publicity.
7	SECTION 3.	The Bureau for Cyberspace and Digital Policy (CDP) and The Department of
8		Justice will oversee this bill.
9		A. Any person found using AI in the United States will be fined \$1000 for
10		the first offense, \$5000 for the second, and will be tried in court for
11		and may receive up to 5 years in prison if a third offense is committed.
12	SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2025. All laws in conflict with
13		this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Provide Dual-Language or Bilingual Education to Publicly Funded Schools to Increase Cultural Awareness and Knowledge

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	SECTION 1.	All publicly funded schools and districts in the United States will be
2		provided with the opportunity to make their school's education and
3		content bilingual in any chosen language. Suggested languages are Spanish,
4		Chinese, Arabic, Tagalog, French, American Sign Language, and other
5		widely spoken languages across the U.S.
6	SECTION 2.	Bilingual education is defined as educational content taught in schools that
7		is taught in two different languages, usually English and another chosen
8		language.
9	SECTION 3.	The Department of Education will oversee this bill.
10		B. 1 million dollars will be provided to the Department of Education from
11		the Department of Defense to implement dual-language education.
12	SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2025. All laws in conflict with
13		this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Reduce Homelessness to Decrease Poverty

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	SECTION 1.	The policy outlined in this bill aims to reduce homelessness and by
2		extension poverty through the approval to construct new urban housing
3		developments. Whos residential area will be distributed to homeless
4		persons through a policy of assisted housing.
5	SECTION 2.	300 new apartment flats will be built. Being able to house 100 people per
6		flat. The combined construction cost for all flats should not exceed 500
7		million dollars and construction will be overseen by the Department of
8		Housing and Urban Development in collaboration with private construction
9		companies. The policy of assisted housing will be implemented via giving
10		authority to the Department of Justice to allow them to peacefully allow
11		Homeless persons to be given a unit in the newly constructed flats.
12	SECTION 3.	The Department of Housing and Urban Development will oversee the
13		construction of new flats. Through issuing construction contracts to private
14		construction companies.
15		The Department of Justice will be given authority to distribute units in the
16		flats to homeless persons after their construction.
17	SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect on November 25th 2025. All laws in conflict
18		with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Improve the Quality of School Meals to Better Child Nutrition

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	SECTION 1.	All U.S. schools must provide fresh, balanced, nutritional meals to their
2		students. To better improve health and meet dietary needs for the students
3		of this nation.
4	SECTION 2.	Quality school meals are defined as fresh, non-frozen, whole foods.
5	SECTION 3.	The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA)
6		C. Each state will be responsible for paying 100 million
7	SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect on January 1st, 2025. All laws in conflict with
8		this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
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
