NOVICE Speech and Debate Events Offered

- Pattern A (Debate): Lincoln Douglas Debate, Parliamentary Debate, Policy Debate, Public Forum Debate
- **Pattern B (Speech)**: After Dinner Speaking, Dramatic Interpretation, DUO, Extemporaneous, Humorous Interpretation, Impromptu, Informative, LIELL, Oratory, Poetry, POI, Prose, Radio
- **Congress** will run its own pattern.
- **Limits**: Students may NOT double-enter in Debate. While our tournament will allow double entry in Individual Events, we will NOT permit double entry in Extemp and another speech event. Congress will NOT be able to enter other events.

RULES

We will follow all **OSAA rules**, as published in the **2024-2024 Speech & Debate Handbook**.

JUDGING

Judges will be current Varsity high school team members from all schools in attendance.

Please encourage new parent judges to shadow the student judges.

One judge covers five entries and will be expected to judge both Debate and IEs.

Judges are expected to be available for the duration of the tournament. If they are not available all day, you will be expected to provide coverage for the time they are absent.

One judge covers six Congress entries.

TOURNAMENT TOPICS

Congress:

Schools wishing to submit Congress Legislation should do so no later than Monday,
October 14th, at 5 pm. Each school may submit up to three pieces of legislation by emailing
macie_mackey@beaverton.k12.or.us. We may supplement with legislation from the NSDA packet
as needed. The legislation will be posted on tabroom.com.

Lincoln Douglas Debate - September/October - Novice Topic:

Resolved: In the United States, national service ought to be mandatory.

Note: The novice Lincoln-Douglas topic is an optional topic that coaches and tournaments may

choose to use each year in September/October, or the first two months of the novice season. The

same topic is used each year and is created to be accessible to new debaters so that coaches can

have a consistent, beginner-friendly topic to guide their novice LD curriculum using educational

materials provided by the NSDA. Coaches are encouraged to check with tournament hosts in their

area before exclusively prepping for one topic over another. Access sample cases on the mandatory

national service topic.
