A Bill to Limit the Maximum amount of money that can be gambled through sports gambling Web Applications.

- 1. BE ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2. Article 1. Under the passage of this legislation, it will necessary that the U tied States ban limit sports gambling, so that there is a maximum amount of money that can be betted on sports gambling websites or apps.
- 3. Article 2: The growth in LSG has led to increased concerns over consumer protections and the impact of LSG on consumer finances. Since 2018, there have been increasing calls to gambling addiction hotlines. These calls seem to be largely driven by increases in sports gambling and other online gambling relative to traditional in-person casino games.
- 4. Article 3: This Bill Shall be passed no later than January 1, 2035

Congress through the commerce clause will oversee the enforcement of this Bill.

5. Article 5. All other laws in conflict with this new policy hereby be considered null and void.
