

1. A Bill to Establish a National Civic Education Fund

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
2. **Section 1** A “National Civic Education Fund” shall be established under the
3. Department of Education to provide grants to public schools for enhanced civic
4. education programming.
5. **Section 2** A. The grants will be used to develop courses, materials, and
6. extracurricular programs aimed at teaching practical civics, including voter
7. registration awareness, community engagement, and knowledge of
8. governmental processes. B. The Department of Education will prioritize grant
9. applications from Title I schools and those in low-income communities.
10. **Section 3** The National Civic Education Fund shall receive an initial appropriation
11. of \$100 million from the Department of Education’s budget reallocation.
12. Additional funding may be approved in subsequent fiscal years.
13. **Section 4** This bill will take effect at the start of the next fiscal year.
14. **Section 5** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and
15. void.

2. A Bill to Ban Single-Use Plastic Bags Nationwide

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
2. **Section 1** The sale or distribution of single-use plastic bags shall be prohibited by all
3. retail establishments within the United States.
4. **Section 2** A. Retail establishments include but are not limited to grocery stores,
5. pharmacies, restaurants offering takeaway, and any vendors that distribute bags at the
6. point of sale.
7. B. Exceptions may be made for bags used for medical or sanitary purposes, such as
8. those for prescription medication or containing fresh produce.
9. **Section 3** Retailers who violate this policy shall be subject to a fine of \$500 per offense,
10. with fines increasing for repeated offenses.
11. **Section 4** This legislation shall take effect one year after passage to allow retailers time
12. to transition and deplete current stocks of single-use plastic bags.
13. **Section 5** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

3. A Bill to Implement a Federal Universal Basic Income Pilot Program

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED:
2. **Section 1** The Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) shall implement
3. a two-year pilot program granting a universal basic income of \$500 per month to
4. a randomly selected pool of 50,000 adult U.S. citizens.
5. **Section 2** A. Eligible adults must be 18 years or older and not currently
6. incarcerated. B. Recipients will be selected through a randomized system
7. ensuring a nationally representative sample by age, geography, and income.
8. **Section 3** The total cost of this pilot program, including administrative expenses,
9. shall not exceed \$600 million over the two-year period. Funding shall be
10. reallocated from existing discretionary spending programs as determined by
11. Congress.
12. **Section 4** Within six months after the program concludes, the HHS shall publish a
13. comprehensive report detailing the economic, social, and health impacts of the
14. pilot.
15. **Section 5** This legislation shall go into effect immediately upon passage, with the
16. pilot distribution to begin within one year.
17. **Section 6** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and
18. void.
