

A Bill to Ensure Accountability for War Crimes in Sudan

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

| 1 | SECTION 1. | The United States shall allocate \$50 million to support international courts |
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| 2 | | in the investigation and prosecution of war crimes in Sudan. |
| 3 | SECTION 2. | The U.S. Department of State shall publish an annual report identifying |
| 4 | | individuals, entities, and governments implicated in war crimes in Sudan. |
| 5 | | All U.Sbased assets of persons or groups determined to be complicit in or |
| 6 | | directly responsible for war crimes in Sudan shall be frozen immediately. |
| 7 | | Sanctioned individuals shall be prohibited from traveling to or through the |
| 8 | | United States. |
| 9 | SECTION 3. | The United States shall provide an additional \$50 million in humanitarian |
| 10 | | aid through USAID in partnership with local and international NGOs |
| 11 | | targeted specifically at survivors of war crimes in Sudan. This aid shall |
| 12 | | include medical, psychological, and legal assistance. |
| 13 | SECTION 4. | This bill shall remain in effect for five years from its date of enactment |
| 14 | | unless reauthorized by Congress. |
| 15 | SECTION 5. | This law shall go into effect immediately upon passage. All laws and conflict |
| 16 | | are hereby declared null and void. |
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A Bill to Educate Voters

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

| 1 | SECTION 1. | The United States Federal Government shall collect and curate publicly |
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| 2 | | available information about all candidates for the House of Representatives |
| 3 | | and the Senate under a new commission known as the Voters Education |
| 4 | | Initiative (VEI). |
| 5 | SECTION 2. | The VEI shall not collect personal information unrelated to a candidate's |
| 6 | | qualifications or public platform, nor shall it endorse or oppose any |
| 7 | | candidate. The information collected by the VEI shall include: |
| 8 | | 1. Biographical information (e.g., education, professional background, |
| 9 | | and public service history). |
| 10 | | 2. Policy positions and platforms as submitted by the candidates. |
| 11 | | 3. Voting records for incumbents. |
| 12 | SECTION 3. | The VEI commission shall be composed of 30 members with no more than |
| 13 | | 15 members from any political party. |
| 14 | SECTION 4. | The commission shall be allocated \$40 million in non election years and |
| 15 | | \$70 million in election years. |
| 16 | SECTION 5. | The VEI shall be established within six months after the bill's passage, and |
| 17 | | the VEI shall be operational no later than two years after establishment. |
| 18 | SECTION 6. | This law shall go into effect immediately upon passage. |
| 19 | SECTION 7. | All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void. |

A Resolution to Support Venezuela's Freedom

| 1 | WHEREAS, | the current dictatorial Venezuelan regime has been in power since 1999 as |
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| 2 | | a Narco-State; |
| 3 | WHEREAS, | the existence of this regime goes in direct contrast to both the Monroe |
| 4 | | Doctrine and the Roosevelt Corollary; |
| 5 | WHEREAS, | Venezuela has committed countless Human Rights violations, leading to an |
| 6 | | ongoing refugee crisis that has displaced roughly 8 million Venezuelans |
| 7 | | over the past decade; with a record-breaking number of roughly 270,000 |
| 8 | | Venezuelans illegally crossing the border in FY 2023; |
| 9 | WHEREAS, | the Venezuelan regime has repeatedly committed election fraud, including |
| 10 | | the most recent offense during the election of July 28th of this year; |
| 11 | WHEREAS, | previous non-aggressive attempts by the international community to bring |
| 12 | | democracy and justice to the South American nation have failed; |
| 13 | RESOLVED, | Congress supports the efforts of the United Nations Security Council to |
| 14 | | ensure enforcement of all relevant Security Council resolutions regarding |
| 15 | | Venezuela and encourages them in those efforts. |
| 16 | FURTHER RES | OLVED, The President is authorized to use the Armed Forces of the United |
| 17 | | States as they determine to be necessary and appropriate in order to— (1) |
| 18 | | defend the national security of the United States against the continuing |
| 19 | | threat posed by Venezuela; (2) enforce multi-laterally all relevant United |
| 20 | | Nations Security Council resolutions regarding Venezuela; (3) bring the |
| 21 | | criminals in charge of the regime to justice; and (4) help replace the current |
| 22 | | Venezuelan government and the establishment of an interim government |
| 23 | | with the goal to conduct free elections under the supervision of the United |
| 24 | | Nations. This election will coincide with the withdrawal of forces. |
