| 2 | SECTION 1. | In order to better enable the National Park Service (NPS) to achieve its | |
| 3 | | mission, the number of visitors allowed in National Park Areas shall be | |
| 4 | | limited. | |
| 5 | SECTION 2. | The NPS is instructed to evaluate an environmentally and logistically | |
| 6 | | sustainable capacity for each of its parks and park areas and to set limits | |
| 7 | | accordingly. The NPS shall have full discretion over the parameters and | |
| 8 | | details of these restrictions, but they are directed to keep matters of | |
| 9 | | equity and accessibility in mind when determining which visitors gain | |
| 10 | | access. | |
| 11 | SECTION 3. | This legislation shall be overseen by the NPS. | |
| 12 | SECTION 4. | This legislation shall take effect on January 1, 2026. | |

The Amtrak Affordability Act

| 2 | SECTION 1. | For a coach ticket on any given route, Amtrak may charge no more than | |
| 3 | | 50% of the average airfare cost for a comparable itinerary. For fare on a | |
| 4 | | sleeper car (where available), Amtrak may charge no more than an | |
| 5 | | amount equal to the average airfare cost for a comparable itinerary. | |
| 6 | SECTION 2. | Congress shall divert an additional \$1 billion annually to Amtrak to | |
| 7 | | subsidize ticket prices and to be used to make Amtrak more affordable | |
| 8 | | and efficient overall. | |
| 9 | SECTION 3. | This legislation shall be overseen by the Department of Transportation, | |
| 10 | | which shall be directed to work with Amtrak to design an efficient and | |
| 11 | | regularly updated system for determining and guaranteeing appropriate | |
| 12 | | fares. | |
| 13 | SECTION 4. | This legislation shall take effect on January 1, 2026. | |
