## A Bill to Include Preschool as a Part of Public Education to Increase Access to Early Childhood Development

1	SECTION 1.	This bill will officially include preschool as a part of public education 3			
2		allowing further accessibility of preschool for children.			
3	SECTION 2.	Preschool will be defined as an early childhood program in which children			
4		combine learning with play and have an emphasis in learning and			
5		development. We define public education as education in schools provided			
6		by the government.			
7		A. The goal of this bill is to allow a focus in childhood development			
8		that seeks to alleviate monetary stress from parents while providing			
9		a safe educational space for children.			
10	SECTION 3.	The Department of Education will be in charge of overseeing the			
11		implementation of this bill.			
12		A. Should any issues arise from the implementation of this bill the			
13		proper corrections will be overseen by the Department of Education			
14		and Department of Justice.			
15		B. Any monetary support that may need to be implemented for this			
16		bill will be taken from the Department of Defense on a yearly basis			
17		that will be decided within the next year during further committee			
18		meetings related to this bill.			
19	SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect on FY 2025. All laws in conflict with this			
20		legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## A Bill to Privatize the United States Postal Service

1	SECTION 1.	United States Postal Service (USPS) shall attempt to become a privatized entity.		
2	SECTION 2. The passage of this bill will open a 180-day bid submission period followed by a 90-da			
3		public comment period. All bid submissions must include the following:		
4		A. a plan to retain not less than 25% of the current United States Postal Service		
5		workforce; and		
6		B. a plan to provide severance packages to all USPS employees let go because of		
7		privatization, which must include not less than six-weeks' pay plus two-weeks'		
8		pay for each year of service; and		
9		C. a plan to continue the current universal service obligation of the USPS for not		
10		less than 10 years.		
11	SECTION 3.Th	e USPS Board of Governors shall review all bids and, at the conclusion of the public		
12	comment period, make a final selection and present it to Congress for final approval.			
13		A. If there are no bids meeting the requirements in Section 2, the USPS will not		
14		become privatized and Sections 3 B-D will not take effect.		
15		B. The winning bidder shall receive an annual federal subsidy of \$10 billion each		
16		year for a total of five years.		
17		C. The Private Express Statutes (18 U.S.C. § 1693-1696 and 39 U.S.C. 601-606) will		
18		be repealed.		
19		D. The Postal Regulatory Commission will continue to exist to enforce legal		
20		obligations on the privatized USPS.		
21	SECTION 4. This legislation shall take effect immediately upon passage.			
22	SECTION 5. A	I laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## **A Bill to Extend Internet Access**

1	SECTION 1. Th	ne Internet Service Agency (ISA), a new independent agency that provides
2		ISP services, will be formed to provide internet services to rural areas
3		lacking internet access.
4	SECTION 2.	SP stands for Internet Service Provider. ISPs provide customers the
5		opportunity to pay a reasonable fee for access to the World Wide Web.
6	SECTION 3.Co	ongress shall oversee the implementation and enforcement of this piece of
7	legislation. Th	e ISA shall receive an initial budget of \$50 billion USD.
8	a.	\$10 billion USD will be used for the formation of the agency: constructing
9	b.	buildings, hiring management, and hiring miscellaneous personnel. \$40 billion USD will be used for the construction and maintenance of the
10	-	network infrastructure.
11	C.	The ISA will charge a base price of \$30 USD every month per household
12	SECTION 4.	for internet access.  This legislation will take effect on FY 2026. All laws in conflict with this
13		legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## A Bill to Implement Campaign Financing Reform to Ensure Equity in Elections

1	SECTION 1.	The United States Department of the Treasury shall create a fund dedicated
2		to the support of financially-eligible challenger candidates for the United
3		States House of Representatives. Candidates will submit requests for
4		funding to be reviewed and approved by a panel of non-partisan
5		committee members, which will be formed from the Federal Election
6		Commission in order to fairly distribute funds.
7	SECTION 2 T	he following definitions apply: Financially-eligible challenger candidates will
8		be defined as candidates for the House of Representatives who file with
9		the Federal Election Commission within the designated time period.
10		Candidates must not have previously held office in the House of
11		Representatives and must have collected less than \$15,000 in campaign
12		donations.
13	SECTION 3.Th	e U.S. Department of the Treasury shall be responsible for the
14		implementation of this legislation. The Treasury will appoint and oversee
15		members of the aforementioned non- partisan panel. The Treasury will
16		collect a 10% tax on all campaign donations to House of Representatives
17		candidates totaling over \$500,000 in order to finance the fund.
18	SECTION 4. T	his legislation will take effect on August 1, 2025. All laws in conflict with this
19		legislation are hereby declared null and void.
