A Bill to Ban Medical Patents

- **SECTION 1**. All medical patents shall hereby be nullified, and the U.S. Patent and 2 Trademark Office shall be restricted from issuing any and all medical 3 patents in the future. The National Institutes of Health (NIH) shall be allocated an additional 60 billion dollars per year to finance the research 5 and development done by the pharmaceutical industry. 6 **SECTION 2**. 7 Medical patents shall be defined as patents on any medication, medical device, or medical process that prevent other competitors from 8 producing similar medications, devices, or processes. 9 10 **SECTION 3.** The U.S. Patent and Trademark Office, the Department of Commerce,

 enforcement of this legislation.

Item 5 - A Bill to Reschedule Psychedelic Drugs to Increase Treatment Options

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	SECTION 1.	The Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) shall reschedule the following psychoactive
2		drugs from Schedule 1 to Schedule 3 of the Controlled Substance Act: MDMA
3		(3,4-methylenedioxymethamphetamine), LSD (lysergic acid diethylamide), and
4		psilocybin.
5	SECTION 2.	These drugs can be prescribed by licensed physicians in order to treat patients
6		with various issues including, but not limited to: anxiety, PTSD (post-traumatic
7		stress disorder), depression, insomnia, and terminal illnesses.
8	SECTION 3.	The Drug Enforcement Agency & the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) shall
9		be responsible for the enforcement of this legislation.
10		A. The DEA shall enforce, restrict, and monitor these medicines as they do other
11		Schedule III drugs.
12		B. The FDA shall be responsible for approving these drugs for more treatments
13		when research deems them effective.
14	SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect on January 1st, 2025. All laws in conflict with this
15		legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Create the Transpacific Security Organization to Counter Chinese Expansionism

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	SECTION 1.	The United States will create the Transpacific Security Organization(TSO) to		
2	formally coun	teract Chinese expansionism and intimidation in Asia. The TSO will follow a		
3	collective defense principle to counter any Chinese intimidation or invasion onto the			
4	territorial integrity of the nation.			
5	SECTION 2.	$\boldsymbol{A.}$ The TSO will follow a collective defense principle where any acts of war		
6		from a non-member state onto a member will result in a joint defensive		
7		response to defend the ally nation and ensure its self-determination.		
8		B. The founding members of the organization will consist of: Japan,		
9		Australia, Taiwan, South Korea, the Philippines, and the United States of		
10		America. Any further expansion of the organization will require consensus		
11		from ¾ of the member states for admission.		
12		C. In the case of Chinese expansionism in the South China Sea or		
13		intimidation of member states, the TSO will convene to decide on the		
14		official course of action by all members.		
15		D. Joint defensive response will be defined as any economic and military		
16		measures to protect the full territorial integrity of a nation, including, but		
17		not limited to economic sanctions, arms shipment, and deployment of		
18		military force.		
19	SECTION 3.	The United States Department of Defense (DOD) will oversee enforcement		
20	along with the	e specific enforcement mechanism.		
21		$\boldsymbol{A}\boldsymbol{.}$ The DOD will collaborate with the founding members to formalize this		
22		organization and enter into a collective defense treaty according to this		
23		legislation.		
24	SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect immediately upon passage. All laws in		
25	conflict with t	his legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Prioritize Trade over Tariffs

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	SECTION 1.	The Generalized System of Preferences Reform Act is hereby enacted in
2		full.
3	SECTION 2.	The President may terminate, suspend, or limit a country's status at any
4		time, provided that Congress is notified 60 days prior to the action. The
5		President may determine the eligibility of a country, including its
6		graduation from the Generalized System of Preferences, using official
7		World Bank statistics or its level of economic development.
8	SECTION 3.	The Trade Policy Staff Committee shall conduct annual product and country
9		reviews, providing recommendations to the President. The U.S
10		International Trade Commission shall report possible effects and proposed
11		changes to the GSP based on the status of the U.S. Economy. U.S. Customs
12		and Border Protection shall enforce GSP at the border.
13	SECTION 4.	This legislation shall take effect immediately upon passage.
14	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

The Haitian Economic and Livelihood Plan (H.E.L.P.)

1	BE IT ENACT	ED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2	SECTION 1.	The United States shall display its dedication to the stabilization of Haiti
3		through sending humanitarian and military aid to its government. Efforts
4		shall also be taken to assist in recovering its economy.
5	SECTION 2.	Humanitarian aid shall be defined as aid concerned with or seeking the
6		promotion of human welfare.
7	SECTION 3.	The funding for this legislation will come out of the Department of
8		Defense's annual budget. The Agency for International Development (AID)
9		shall be tasked to oversee the implementation of this aid.
10		A. Humanitarian aid shall amount to five billion dollars.
11		B. Military aid shall amount to ten thousand soldiers
12		C. The Agency for International Development shall be required to send a
13		monthly report to the Senate and House of Representatives to report
14		on the progress and effectiveness of this aid. If it is determined that
15		this aid has not resulted in considerable improvement, a two-thirds
16		majority vote shall be sufficient to halt all efforts.
17	SECTION 4.	An additional three billion dollars of aid shall be directed towards
18		providing any and all U.Sbased corporations seeking to build new
19		factories or places of business in Haiti with a one-time grant worth ten
20		million dollar or 50% of their expenditures that fiscal year, whichever is
21		less.
22		A. Haitian citizens must account for at least 75% of a corporation's
23		workforce to be eligible for this grant.
24	SECTION 5.	This legislation will begin implementation immediately after passage. All
25		laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Ban Fracking

2	SECTION 1.	This bill prohibits federal agencies from issuing permits for the expansion
3		of fracking or fracked oil and natural gas infrastructure, including
4		infrastructure, including infrastructure intended to extract, transport, or
5		burn natural gas or oil. By 2030 all fracking permits will be revoked. By
6		2030 the United States will be fracking free.
7	SECTION 2.	Hydraulic fracturing or fracking is a process to extract underground
8		resources such as oil or gas from a geologic formation by injecting water,
9		a propping agent (e.g., sand), and chemical additives into a well under
10		enough pressure to fracture the geological formation.
11	SECTION 3.	The Department of Energy and Environmental Protection Agency shall be
12		deemed responsible for implementing this bill.
13	SECTION 4.	Upon passage, this legislation will take effect July 1, 2025. All laws in
14		conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void
