# A Bill to Restrict Posting Children's Identity on Public Social Media Platforms

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	SECTION 1.	We hereby prohibit the posting of children under the age of consent on any
2		public social media platform.
3	SECTION 2.	Children under the age of consent, or 18 years of age, are prohibited to
4		post personal information regarding date of birth, and home address.
5		Likewise, detailed photos of a child's face are prohibited from posting.
6	SECTION 3.	The Federal Communications Commission (FCC) will oversee and enforce
7		this regulation.
8		A. Identification analyzing technology, used on various media platforms,
9		will be implemented across all forms of social media.
10		B. Accounts that violate this regulation will be reported and banned from
11		the platform.
12	SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2026. All laws in conflict with
13		this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## A Bill to Effectively Ban Vapes in the U.S.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	SECTION 1.	Vapes that contain more than 0.5% nicotine are to be effectively banned in
2		the United States; i.e. the prohibition of the sale and purchasing of vapes
3		that contain more than 0.5% nicotine.
4	SECTION 2.	Vape is defined as inhale and exhale vapor containing over 0.5% nicotine
5		and flavoring produced by a device designed for this purpose.
6	SECTION 3.	The FDA will oversee the enactment and continued upkeep of this
7		legislation.
8		A. This bill does not affect the sale or purchase of vapor products that do
9		not contain nicotine.
10		B. Funding for the upkeep and enactment of this legislation is projected to
11		cost \$250 million dollars which would be procured by taking funding
12		out of the existing military budget and a substantial fine of \$2,000 for
13		anyone found in violation of the sale portion of this legislation.
14		C. Anyone found in violation of the purchasing portion of this legislation
15		shall have the vape confiscated as if it were any other illegal item with
16		no additional charge or punishment.
17	SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect on December 1st, 2026. All laws in conflict
18		with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## A Bill to Ban ICE from safe havens

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	<b>SECTION 1</b> .	Immigration and customs enforcement (ICE), shall not have jurisdiction in
2		safe havens.
3	SECTION 2.	Jurisdiction: the ability to enter, arrest, assert authority, or inquire about
4		individuals in a certain area. Safe haven: an area where an individual can
5		seek care or shelter including, hospitals, free clinics, homeless shelters, food
6		seek care of shelter including, hospitals, free clinics, homeless shelters, root
7		banks, schools, and churches.
8	SECTION 3.	Any officer who violates this legislation shall be immediately dismissed
9		from ICE
10	<b>SECTION 4.</b>	The Department of Homeland Security (DHS) shall oversee the prohibition
11		of ICE in safe havens.
12	SECTION 5.	This legislation will take effect on August 1, 2025. All laws in conflict with
13		this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
