Management reserves the right to handle situations as they arise and as we see fit to best facilitate student learning. We will be using NSDA rules (including current topics).

This tournament will follow all NSAA bylaws. This is a high school only tournament. Students must be eligible according to NSAA and may only compete for the school in which they are currently enrolled. The NSAA bylaws can be viewed at nsaahome.org.

Online balloting – we will be using online balloting for all events. Please make sure that all of your students and judges are "linked" to accounts in Tabroom.com.

We urge all judges to write a paradigm. Paradigms help debate stay educational and help students learn adaptation skills. If you have any questions about how to set up a paradigm, do not hesitate to ask.

Lincoln-Douglas Debate -

We will be using the January/February topic FOR BOTH DIVISIONS. Will follow the 6-3-7-3-4-6-3 format with **4 minutes prep time**. Varsity and novice divisions will have five prelims (powered after two) breaking to quarters.

Public Forum Debate -

We will use the January Topic. Varsity and Novice divisions will have five prelims (powered after two) breaking to quarters in novice and breaking all winning records in Varsity.

Congress -

- We will utilize NSDA style of congress at this tournament.
- We will be using the Nebraska Docket. Students may not rearrange the docket.
